Call to Order.

Co-Chairperson Benelli called the meeting to order.

2. Approval of minutes, as written, from the September 14th and October 5th Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee Meetings and the various sub-committee minutes from October 5th and 19th and November 2nd and 9th.

It was moved by Committeemember Villanueva-Saucedo, seconded by Committeemember Moeser, that the minutes from the September 14 and October 5, 2017 Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee Meetings and the various sub-committee minutes from October 5 and 19, November 2 and 9, 2017 be approved.

Co-Chairperson Benelli declared the motion carried unanimously by those present.

3. Hear a presentation regarding the Imagine Mesa campaign results.

Co-Chairperson Leyba introduced Chief Digital Officer Julia Thompson who displayed a PowerPoint presentation (See Attachment 1) related to the Imagine Mesa campaign results.

Ms. Thompson explained that part of the campaign was to receive ideas but also to enhance the City's digital strategy by developing different communications, creative campaigns, and use data from social media to better understand how the City interacts with the residents.

Ms. Thompson highlighted the campaign results and displayed the Neighborland software benchmarks compiled by the City compared to San Francisco, CA. (See Pages 3 and 4 of Attachment 1)

In response to a question posed by Co-chairperson Benelli, Ms. Thompson replied that San Francisco, CA has been using Neighborland software for three years and the numbers presented are an aggregate.

Ms. Thompson displayed graphs depicting the five vision forums, devices used, and age groups. She pointed out that the play forum was the most popular in terms of visits. She highlighted the most visited ideas, the highest traffic drivers, and the heat map that showed 85% of the respondents live in Mesa. (See Pages 5 through 8 of Attachment 1)

Co-Chairperson Benelli requested that staff supply the committee with the number of events that the Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee attended.

Assistant City Manager Kari Kent outlined the costs of the campaign that totaled approximately \$90,000: Consultant contract - Ideas Collide, LLC - \$50,000, Neighborland software - \$22,000, and social media \$14,000. She confirmed that as of December 31, 2017 the Neighborland subscription will expire and that staff is considering other mechanisms within the City's current website provider to continue the social media outreach.

Ms. Thompson explained that the information gathered from the Neighborland software will be archived for one year and the information can be accessed but not modified.

Co-Chairperson Benelli thanked staff for the presentation.

4. Presentation and discussion of the sub-committee recommendations for final recommendation to the City Council.

Principal Planner Tom Ellsworth displayed a Power Point presentation (See Attachment 1) related to the sub-committee recommendations for final recommendation to the City Council.

Co-Chairperson Benelli explained that a presentation at the December 7, 2017 Study Session will be given on the five vision forums and the top three ideas recommended by the subcommittees.

Discussion ensued relative to each of the sub-committees five vision forums and confirming the top three ideas to be presented to Council.

The top three vision forum ideas recommended by the sub-committee members are as follows:

- Play (See Page 10 of Attachment 1)
 - Youth sports complex
 - Bike/pedestrian trails

- Park features that contain a notable structure or design and continue to seek funding options for the 2012 voter-approved park bond programs that did not get completed. (splash pad regulations are currently being reviewed and City staff are advocating for legislative change)
- Home (See Page 11 of Attachment 1)
 - Proactive code compliance officers
 - Control of the feral cat population
 - Increase numbers of Police Officers
 - Possible future ideas: 1 and 5
- Green Future (See Page 12 of Attachment 1)
 - Light rail to extend to Superstition Springs Mall (not by 2030) and more bus routes on North/South roads between Gilbert and Power in East Mesa (2 and 3 combined)
 - Food waste composting facility/Anaerobic Digestion
 - Expand bulk pick up days (not free) and large metal City clean up bins available to neighborhoods at least twice per year
 - Possible future ideas: 1 and 5
- Work and Innovation (See Page 13 of Attachment 1)
 - Innovation District and technology committee (1 and 4 combined)
 - Build a STEAM center on Las Sendas Mountain
 - Create a restaurant innovation district

5. Discuss final presentation format.

Co-Chairperson Benelli invited the Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee to the December 7, 2017 Council Study Session meeting at 7:30 a.m. She asked that at a minimum, the leads to each sub-committee attend.

Ms. Benelli explained that the presentation to Council will review the process the subcommittees used and present the top three ideas from each forum.

Mr. Ellsworth stated that he would add the supporting ideas from each sub-committee to the final three forum ideas from the excel spreadsheet. (See Attachment 2)

Ms. Kent thanked the Committee for their time and effort on this project.

6. Scheduling of Meetings and General Information.

Co-Chairperson Benelli stated there will be no future meeting. She requested that one member from each sub-committee review their slide for the presentation.

7. Adjournment.

Without objection, the Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee meeting adjourned at 6:34 p.m.



- d) Discussion: Unnumbered "planetarium and science museum." Idea great but mabe on the eastside. High effort to get results. May take too long. Maybe plan for this in the future. Want to revisit in next meeting
- e) Discussion: Idea # 22 Thanksgiving Point a Utah private garden/museum. Move planetarium idea under cultural heritage (#21). Idea #18 questions about velodrome. **No** on idea. All in agreement. Idea #19. **No** on idea. All in agreement.
- f) Discussion: Idea #20: Committee asked Mesa staff for overview of current trail system. Eric presented a map and 5-year forecasted plan. Bike trails are generally built along trails. Would considering a plan to connect paths for the long-range. Need for East Mesa paths. Committee agreed to keep #20 and merge with Idea #3, and to increase discussion on hiking vs. multiuse path.

- g) Idea #17. Parks operations. Being taken into consideration by staff currently. **No** on idea. All in agreement.
- h) Idea #16. Pools. Keep on list. Discussion about year-round operations and the need for more adult swim time. Eastmark question: is there a discussion with Queen Creek for a public pool at new high school there (Yes). Need for pools in east / south Mesa.
- i) Idea #15. Skate Parks. Move to Idea #15-B with pools, but keep Idea #15 on list for further consideration.
- j) Idea #14. New Parks. Keep this. Get more information on planning for the future.
- k) Idea #13. Connections. Discussion: Move #13 into #3 as the items are similar.

- p) Idea #6. Lehi Falls. Yes, consider further. Marc commented that the City does not own any of the land. Committee members agree to leave on list, but get more information later
- q) Idea #5. Downtown activation. Discussion: Need for activation but may involve more departments. Chairperson Jo commented that this should be more economic development related. Justin commented that city needs to be involved in business attraction. Committee agreed to keep on list.
- r) Idea #4. Move to #8 to park features.
- s) Idea #2. Site 17. Discussion on what /where Site 17 is. Justin offered it was a big beach area with shops. Jo suggested that it was like the demographics of the area might not support the area. Committee agreed to drop the idea from the list. Will not consider further.

- t) Idea #1. Youth Sports Complex. Marc gave background summary: Current shortage of playing fields. VisitMesa's biggest interest is sports tourism but Mesa is missing large tournaments due to lack of fields. Proposal to use unused space @ Red Mountain Park for 20-field venue. Committee agreed to consider further. Would like more information.
- u) Committee would like presentations (in this order) from Idea Creator of Idea #1 Youth Sports; #6 Lehi Falls; and park amenities. Discussion: Make sure we remember the citizen impact; wants general cost estimates.

I. Call to order

Jo Martin, Chairperson, called to order the regular meeting of the Imagine Mesa Play Subcommittee at 5:37pm on October 19, 2017 at Mesa City Plaza, Room 650.

II. Roll call

The following persons were present: Subcommittee members: Matt Law, Justin Murdock, and Jo Martin. City of Mesa Staff: Marc Heirshberg, Aimee Manis, Al Zubi, Janet Woolum, and Tom Ellsworth

III. Minutes from October 5 meeting were approved.

IV. Requested Presentations

1. VisitMesa representatives, Marc Garcia, President and CEO, and Rick Adams, Vice Chairperson, made a presentation to the Subcommittee about Mesa Plays, the multipurpose, multi-field youth and amateur sports complex. (see presentation)

Q&A: Matt asked if there are national comparable sports complex. Marc G. mentioned Grand Park, Indiana. He also asked about use during the summer and hotel capacity. Marc G. said they were talking to potential hotels, and the facility could be used year-round.

Q&A: Justin asked about how to carve out times for local to use the space. Marc H discussed the scheduling process for local teams.

Q&A: Matt asked if a more accurate representation of the field house was available. Marc G. said they will be updating the presentation.

Q&A: Jo asked if there has been any polling on the potential bond. Not as of this date.

- 2. The Landing at Lehi Falls presentation was not available.
- 3. Marc Heirshberg, City of Mesa, Director of Parks, Recreation & Community Facilities, made a presentation to the Subcommittee about park amenities. He discussed: splash pads, dog parks, sand volleyball, trees, pickleball courts, restrooms, skateboard parks, playgrounds, and amenities in indoor recreation centers

V. Discussion

More discussion about Mesa Plays. Justin suggested that maybe the public wants something other than a huge Mesa Plays project. Matt: "I think Imagine Mesa should be more grassroots than a big multi-field sports complex."

Subcommittee discussed individual ideas to consider going forward. Justin suggested they cut down the list to the top 5: Idea #1-Youth Sports Complex, #3-Bike and Pedestrian Paths; #5-Downtown Activation; #6-Landing at Lehi Falls; and #7-Indoor Recreation Space. Justin commented that he didn't want his proximity to Lehi Falls to be seen as a conflict, but is very interested in that project; believes that Mesa Plays is going to happen because it has legs. Matt asked if the indoor field house of Mesa Plays could serve as an indoor recreation center. Marc H. discussed the difference between a recreation center and field house concept.

Idea #3 Bike and Pedestrian Paths—Jo mentioned the issue of connectivity of families in all these spaces

Idea #5 Downtown Activation: Jo stated that this has more of an economic focus and should be considered by another group. Tom mentioned that the Work/Innovation subcommittee was discussing downtown. For that reason, the subcommittee agreed to eliminate Idea #5 from consideration, but consider downtown as part of Idea #10 Regional Events.

Idea # 6 Landing at Lehi Falls: not enough information right now to discuss. Tom said he was in contact with idea champion, who was in New York. They are exploring options for the subcommittee to communicate with him at the next meeting.

Subcommittee members agreed to continue to review and evaluate ideas #1, #3, #6, and #7. They also agree to add

- (a) Idea #8 Park Features as it relates to pools;
- (b) Idea #10 Regional Events; and
- (c) Discuss previous bond projects (e.g., water plants, Monterey Park) that were not finished

Jo asked members to use the evaluation spreadsheet in preparation for the next meeting, scheduled for November 2, so they can fully discuss the top items.

VI. Adjournment

Jo Martin, Chairperson, adjourned the meeting at 7:31pm.





Imagine Mesa, Play Subcommittee Meeting Minutes

November 2, 2017

I. Call to order

Jo Martin called to order the regular meeting of the Imagine Mesa Play Subcommittee at 5:35pm on November 2, 2017 at Mesa City Plaza, Room 650.

II. Roll call

The following persons were present: Subcommittee members: Matt Law, Justin Murdock, Winnie Kaplan, and Jo Martin. City of Mesa Staff: Marc Heirshberg, Aimee Manis, Janet Woolum, and Eric Guderian.

III. Minutes from October 19 meeting were approved as corrected.

IV. Requested Presentations

 Presentation by representatives regarding the Landing at Lehi Falls. (see presentation)

Q&A: Jo asked if funding has been promised by any state/federal organization. Presenter: ADOT stated the land would be turned over to the City or rented for a small fee, as long as the City maintains the area.

V. Discussion of Ideas

Janet Woolum provided information on moving forward using working documents for evaluating ideas. Jo Martin opened discussion and ask subcommittee members to provide ratings of the ideas based on categories: Transformational, Momentum Builder, Quick Win, and Derailer.

Idea #1 Youth Sports. Matt: Transformational; Winnie: Quick Win—likes the project; Justin: Transformational—for Mesa and East Valley; Jo: Transformational—asks about a revenue source

Idea #3 Bike-pedestrian paths. Matt: Quick Win—but city already has a lot going on in this area, would like to see a larger plan. Winnie: Quick Win/Momentum Builder—don't need to spend \$\$ on trails, need connections to light rail. Justin: Transformational—maybe trails could bring more people to Mesa. Jo: Transformational—discussed her past w/Apache Junction economic development board

- Idea #6 Landing at Lehi Falls. Matt: Derailer—wasn't enthused about the project, went to visit the site and didn't agree with its viability. Saw some possibilities but maybe not today. Winnie: Momentum Builder. Justin: could be Transformational, but need to determine the feasibility of purchasing nursery land. Also commented that it is close to the Loop 202 so many metro visitors could go right into Mesa through Lehi Falls which could be a big draw. Jo: Derailer—could see potential but concerns about city economics and funding, particularly related to ongoing maintenance.
- Idea #7 Indoor Recreation Space. Matt: Transformational—w/hot summers Mesa could make a great indoor space for play/recreation that could be epic. Winnie: Derailer: private sector has already built these. Cost could be high. If not privatized it would be hard to manage. Justin: Derailer—maintenance costs could be high. Jo: Transformational: need to have a place for low-income kids in summer.
- Idea #8 Park Features (Pools). Matt: Quick Win. Hard to make it transformational; however, there is a need for pools on the east side. Reminded the group about quality of life impact is what brings people here. Suggested the city can transform older parks to have more interesting features. Winnie: Quick Win—supportive of pools but not another waterpark. Justin: Quick Win—but not a low effort and may not be a high impact for the whole city. However, the multi-use complex could be more of an economic driver. Jo: Transformational on the splash pad side, Quick Win if the county could change their code. Suggested the group recommend the city work to get code changed.
- Idea #10 Regional Events. Matt: Transformational—want to bring bigger festivals here. Winnie: Transformational—yearly events are a way to bring people in. Justin: Quick Win—but narrow down the events. He likes Merry on Main but not downtown. City needs a bigger venue elsewhere to pull people in. Jo: Quick Win—city could be better with attractions.
- **Previous projects**. Jo talked to council member about the current projects who said they are still relevant. Jo wants to make sure we don't lose the push to finish this development for the East side of Mesa. Justin and Matt agreed.

Jo asked the group to write down their top 3 ideas. Results:

- 1. Youth sports complex
- 2. Bike/pedestrian trails. Matt suggests that this needs to have big ideas withit
- 3. Park features, including splash pads

Additional discussion.

Subcommittee members had questions for Eric Guderian, Mesa Transportation Department, about the options/issues for trails near freeways, canals and powerlines.

The group discussed economic development opportunities along these paths.

They also discussed parks and pool features; the importance of adding shade; keeping currently bonded projects in the works; and using the leverage points they had to change County code as it relates to pools and splash pads.

Janet talked about next steps and encouraged them to fill out the impact/effort matrix for each idea under consideration. Jo suggested they all fill out the forms, complete the ratings, and send to her by November 10, so she could compile the information/recommendations for the presentation at full advisory committee meeting on November 16.

VI. Adjournment

Jo Martin adjourned the meeting at 7:26pm.

With approximately 300 single family home permits approved each month the area is growing rapidly. Residential, assisted living facilities, and businesses will generate calls. The chief station to service Eastmark currently is station #219.

Question B: Are there plans to build a Fire Station at 32nd St and McDowell Rd in the future? If yes, what is the timeline?

Answer B: Data is being scrubbed and looked at. The Lehi Crossing area has two stations and both require the need to go around. Crismon and Broadway will be looked at first rather than the Lehi Crossing area.

Answer C: Currently staff receive two-part training that includes customer service. AZ Post standards require a minimum of 530 hours, City of Mesa Police Academy standard is 830

hours and includes: 8 hours of Cultural Awareness, 4 hours of Community Problem Solving, 4 hours of Victimology, 8 hours of Mental Illness. In 2016 received de-escalation training, dealing with mentally ill, developed Crisis Response Team. Commander and PD group developed a Mental Health Advisory Board. 2018 Training will include Use of Force Training. Challenges: Need personnel to instruct and personnel to attend, overtime is not available. Required training takes precedence – OSHA, Gas Mask, Fire training. Extra training becomes secondary.

Opportunities: Briefing training, training in the parking lot for squad officers, computer and video based training for 15 – 20 minutes.

Customer service is priority, supervisor monitors appropriate dealings with the public. PD has robust complaint process — citizens can complain online or to supervisor, and outside instruction training is available. If it is a one-time occurrence, the supervisor deals with the issue(s) on a case by case basis. If it is a serious problem, then wide scale training is needed. The city has invested a lot of money in body cameras, all officers wear body cameras and audits are conducted, proof that another layer of customer service is provided. Police evaluation of body cameras saw a decrease in 75% of complaints, that is consistent across the nation.

Committee Member Jake Brown would like to see more good stories about Mesa PD, and asked if the Police Department budgets for good stories?

Answer: Officers are not doing good for approval but because it is the right thing to do. For example; an officer was aware of a woman suffering from dementia and the officer removed his uniform and mowed her lawn. Police Department conducts community surveys using social media, Facebook, press releases to get the stories out there but the message cannot be sent without the proper procedure.

Answer D: It is not against the law to panhandle, unless other laws are violated no action can be taken. In place is trespassing enforcement, citizens can file paperwork to address no trespassing, then a log is created with the business and persons are identified. The property owner will need to trespass the person from the location.

Challenges: Homelessness, there is a correlation between panhandling and the homeless population. There are mental health and drug dependency issues as well. Without proper resources, even arrests would be a problem.

Opportunities: Homeless navigator in downtown Mesa, Mental Health professionals within PD-a person that could point them in the right direction. PD is heavily involved with non-profits and partnerships.

Question F: What community policing is Mesa PD already doing?

Answer F: Mesa PD interacts with the community and not just on service calls. There are 11 community forums in various segments; Hispanic, business, and senior forums. GAIN night where officers attend watch parties. Special Olympics, AZ Torch Run, Sporting Events, School Resource Officers, Officers attend Advisory Boards.

Question F: Are there any future community policing plans Mesa PD is looking to initiate? If yes, please describe. Is it possible to replicate coffee with a cop in the park?

Answer F: There are coffee with a cop events, where officers were at a shop and citizens were encouraged to attend. Chief Batista suggested for officers to attend in an area where they would not normally attend. The possibility of events at a grocery store and neighborhoods.

There are mixed feelings officers not in uniform, there are opportunities when officers are in uniform and it is associated with help, information, and advice. Officers must dress to the audience.

Challenges: Certain groups ask for Officers to be in uniform.

Models for future PD staffing—Split in thirds; service, administration, and proactive time. Many times, staffing levels prevent proactive time. Examples of proactive time; Angel Walk, Movies in Park, Food Truck Festivals, Motorcycles on Main, Aids Walk. PD has a good model in place, crime fighting model is monitored, sending resources, and there is a big sense of urgency to locate and prevent another crime.

Committee Member Jake Brown asked for the cost for one officer.

Answer: One officer is around \$160k. They have seen a loss of 21 sworn positions with budget constraints.

Ms. Brady indicated that the City of Mesa has considered it, but it has been cost prohibitive.

Ms. Brady explained that people do not want cats back in their neighborhood after TNR; however, TNR is currently the best-known practice across the country. Ms. Brady also shared some examples of methods attempted by other cities with little to no success for multiple reasons.

Ms. Villanueva-Saucedo asked if the only real solution is to increase the TNR funding.

Ms. Brady indicated that was correct, and that the City of Mesa has seen some success with TNR, specifically in certain zip codes where grant funding was received.

Mr. Brown asked where staff receives grants funding.

Ms. Brady indicated that Petsmart Charities is the main source.

Ms. Villanueva-Saucedo asked if the City of Mesa could partner with shelters or other agencies for grant.

Ms. Brady mentioned that Staff would be glad to partner.

- Challenge is adding additional customers to current district cooling system
- District cooling system utilizes chillers- reaching end of natural 15-year life and will need replacing
 - Expensive to replace
- Need more funding sources before adding new customers
 - Currently not recovering all operating costs
- Question: If an investment in the system is made, would costs be recovered?
 - o Depends on the number of customers gained
 - o It would probably work out to have a positive return down the road

- Question: Would a raise in rates still allow cooling to be competitive with traditional A/C?
 - o Not currently prepared with answer
 - Cooling works out better with vertical development, such as campus environments
- Question: Why cooling at Benedictine University?
 - Not sure, could have been sold as beneficial
- Question: Is any grant funding available?
 - Not really.

Buried Powerlines- Frank McRae

- 60-65% of current electrical system is already underground
- In order to move more underground, many components need to be rebuilt- permits, casements, etc.
- All customers need to agree to drop the lines b/c of potential placement of transformer and pad in front yard

 - Current: Pima Dr. and others

- Lithium batteries have predicted life of 5-8 years, but AZ life is shorter due to heat
- Changing batteries is difficult and time consuming- cranes, etc.
- Cost differential: GE Residential = \$150.00, Battery = \$800.00

- Solar batteries not the perfect resource- battery disposal is difficult

- 1.9 mile extension will be completed by 2019

 - Passenger/commuter route along the 60 and 101 into downtown
- Taking light rail east of Gilbert has issues- no more bus service, but densely populated

- ☐ Alleys have served several functions:
 - Solid waste collection (discontinued)
 - Utility services
 - Wet, city water, wastewater
 - Dry, electric, SRP, gas, telecom, cable

- Mesa utilities will often be joint trenched (water/gas)
- Mesa has a right to the alleys for access to the utilities
- Public utility easements, owner owns the land, City has the right to access them
 - Issues, the utility company must access your backyard to service the utilities, pool or other yard scape was built near or on top of the utilities.
- Some utilities have since moved out of the alleys into the front of the property
- o Parking for driveways, carports, garages (these are public right of ways, legal access to the homes), old planning designs/fads. Cannot be blocked.
- Maintenance of alleys is challenging
- Unwelcome activities in alleys
- As of 2007, wet utilities in the street, dry utilities in public easement behind the right of way
- Eastmark is unique in their right of way planning
- In 2007 Legal opinion that if alleys were gated, no fences could be moved, City still needed access to right of way and utilities.
- If the alleys were to be abandoned, the City no longer had any authority to enforce issues between neighbors.
- Homeowners property taxes increased, they were not anticipating it.
- 2012 Legal said that City can maintain the alleys as right of way, can gate the alleys and allow the neighbors to have access to them. Council has implemented policy and procedures.
 - o 900 alleys have been gated
 - Neighborhood Services Department identified neighborhoods that were interested in gating.
 - o Approximately 90 were not eligible due to access to their driveways
 - o Transportation budgets for the gates, installation and repairs to thegates.
 - Homeowners have keys. Police enforced with no trespassing signs.
 - o City maintains keys to the gates to allow access for the utility service providers.
 - o Seen a reduction in illegal dumping and in crime in the alleys
 - o Homeowners maintain the alleys

- The current rate covers the direct costs (truck, fuel, driver and landfill disposal) only. Increasing the service to 4 days a week would not increase the costs, we would continue to cover the direct costs. We would not need to purchase more trucks, we would need to increase staffing.
- The direct mailing marketing would be \$25,000.

1. Call to Order

Sub-Committee Lead Levi Leyba called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m.

2. Approval of Minutes from October 19, 2017 Sub-Committee Meeting

A motion to approve the Work/Innovation Sub-Committee minutes from the October 19, 2017 meeting was made by Greg Arnett; seconded by Linda Moeser; the motion was carried by a vote of 3-0.

3. Hear presentations on requested information

Jeff McVay, Downtown Transformation Manager, from the City Manager's Office, presented on the barriers to entry for business coming to Mesa and what progress has been made. The Sub-Committee commented on the successes that the town of Gilbert is experiencing. Jeff mentioned that a significant difference between the Town of Gilbert and the City of Mesa is that Gilbert owns the land that businesses are built upon.

Jeff also addressed that the Town of Gilbert removed the upfront costs, but the City of Mesa does not have that luxury. There was a strong push for ImagineMesa ideas to include more restaurants downtown. However, we do not own the downtown area where the restaurants would be. Jeff stated the once there are over 5 to 6 successful restaurants, the area is identified as a "destination".

To attract more restaurants, Mesa is doing the following—

- 1. Small business startup utility rate incentive. We allow for 25% discount for three years water and electric provided that the business can prove that two jobs were created.
- 2. Make the environment more attractive through façade improvement
 - a. Trees are cheapest and most economic benefit we can do.

3. Three future projects:

- a. Country Club and Main (Bailey brakes) 20K feet will be made available for commercial retail with 200 new apartments created. They will be Market rate, one, two, and 3 bedrooms.
- Sprinklers are required and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) provides up to 20K to business provided that two jobs were created.
- c. The Grid (next to Benedictine), 800 parking spaces available and just over 100 spaces used. November 20th to Council, 300 new units and 14,000 square feet commercial space. Developer unknown.
- d. Drew parking (Parking lot west of Heritage) 15 story hotel and apartment complex.

Entry barrier costs removal is not an option for us. However, the number one factor to increasing the success downtown is having more (rooftops) is having residents live right next to the Arts Center. The environment is also very important and therefore needs to be attractive.

Diversity is a key component, but not just regarding population. Diverse or full life cycle is possible with residents raising families in the same area where in the future, they can retire.

One of the many positives taking place is that intrapreneurship is abounding in the downtown area. There are only two national chains in the vicinity. Jeff did provide information that Council has provided direction to procure a master plan for site 17.

The Mayor also has an Initiative to create an innovation district. Create synergies and identify what the niche is for medical devices, tech etc. However, we don't want to compete with those that are nearby.

4. Discuss and Evaluate Ideas
