*5-a 17-1037 Purchase of Replacement Network Hardware and Services for the Information Technology Department (Citywide)

The network routers and switches in use today in the point-to-point microwave radio network support TRWC critical voice communications, critical public safety data traffic, and Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) traffic from water, wastewater, and natural gas utility sites. Replacement of the outdated network hardware will allow the City of Mesa and its partner agencies in the TRWC to be able to take advantage of greater routing speeds, higher reliability and increased capacity for future growth.

The Information Technology Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase from the State of Arizona cooperative contract and lowest-quoted vendors, ENS and Integration Partners, at \$629,368. This purchase is funded between the City of Mesa (\$541,100) and various members of the TWRC (\$88,268).

*5-b	<u> 17-1032</u>	Three-Year Term Contract for Fertilizer for the Parks, Recreation and
		Community Facilities Department (Citywide)

This contract will provide fertilizer to promote turf health at the Dobson Ranch Golf Course, Mesa Cemetery, Aquatics Facilities, Parks Retention Basins and Sports Fields. This solicitation was completed using a reverse auction, which allows bidders to compete in a live auction. The City realized a 17% reduction to the previous contracted rate.

The Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive and responsible bidders: Wilbur Ellis; Horizon Distribution; Target Specialty Products; and J.R. Simplot Company; cumulatively not to exceed \$160,000 annually, based on estimated requirements.

*6-a	<u>17-1030</u>	Extinguishing a 20-foot easement for a waterline located at 1356 East Baseline
		Road (District 3)

The owner has requested the City extinguish a 20-foot easement for a waterline to accommodate the expansion and remodel of the leasing office.

*6-b 17-1031 Abandoning four areas of the right-of-way in the 2100 block of West Rio Salado Parkway and one area of the right-of-way near the intersection of Riverview Auto Drive and Cubs Way to accommodate proposed monument signs for the Chicago Cubs Stadium at Sloan Park. (District 1)

Approving and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community for the receipt and distribution of \$1,080,000 in Proposition 202 Funds. (Citywide)

Under this Agreement, \$500,000 is awarded to the following City of Mesa programs: Fire and Medical, Immunization Program (\$85,000); Police Department, Field Intelligence Officer Program Equipment (\$79,565), Making Every Student Accountable (\$14,181), and Computer Forensics Unit Training and Equipment (\$35,965); Mesa Counts on College, GED Program Expansion (\$35,289); Downtown Transformation, Downtown Façade Improvements (\$100,000); Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities, Kleinman Park Playground Renovation (\$100,000); and the i.d.e.a. Museum, Bolstering Child Development Through Creativity (\$50,000).

The balance of the funds will be distributed to other local community agencies, including A New Leaf, Child Crisis Center, Gene Lewis Boxing Club, Mesa Public Schools, Sojourner Center and the United Food Bank.
