Subject:	Dollar Limit Increase for the Term Contract for Vaccines for the Fire and Medical Department's Childhood Immunization Program as well as Public Safety Employees (Funded by the CMS Healthcare Innovation Grant) (Citywide)

Purpose and Recommendation

Council is requested to approve a Dollar Limit Increase to the Term Contract for Vaccines as recommended.

Mesa Fire and Medical (MFMD), and Purchasing recommend authorizing a dollar limit increase of \$30,333.00 annually, increasing the annual contract amount from \$110,000.00 to \$140,333.00 annually, over the next three years. This contract utilizes the Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP) cooperative contract with multiple vendors: Sanofi Pasteur, GlaxoSmithKline, Merck Sharp & Dohme Corp., and McKesson.

Background / Discussion

For more than eleven years, MFMD has purchased immunizations for sworn personnel and Tuberculosis (TB) testing, as well as flu vaccinations for Police and Fire employees. Fire recruits are immunized against Hepatitis B, as required by Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). Sworn fire personnel are immunized against several other communicable diseases such as Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella, and Hepatitis A as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), OSHA, and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1582. Sworn Fire employees receive TB testing annually as recommended by NFPA 1582. Police and Fire employees are also immunized against the influenza virus each year as recommended by the CDC and OSHA.

For the past nine years, MFMD has immunized children utilizing roving clinics at schools. Traditionally all of the vaccines were provided by the State and County Immunization Grants. However due to Federal and State vaccine budget cuts as of 10/1/2012, community immunization programs cannot provide federally purchased flu vaccine to insured children, even to those school children with a very high deductible. This poses a serious threat to the continuation of providing this service within schools. Since the school program is a convenience to many working families, this may prohibit many of these children from receiving Influenza, Meningitis and Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis vaccines resulting in potential illness, disease spread, and school absenteeism.

On September 23, 2013, Council approved the initial five-year contract utilizing the MMCAP cooperative contract to support the City's Childhood Immunization Program, MFMD disease prevention program, and the City's Police and Fire employee flu vaccine programs.

MFMD has been awarded additional immunization dollars through the CMS Healthcare Innovation Grant. The grant funding is \$90,999.00 for the next three years, or \$30,333.00 each year. Through the Community Care Units the MFMD will have the ability to immunize more citizens within the community utilizing the additional grant dollars.

Alternatives

Council may choose not to authorize the dollar limit increase using the CMS Healthcare Innovation grant funding.

Fiscal Impact

The dollar limit increase of \$30,333.00 annually is funded by the CMS Healthcare Innovation Grant for the next three years (Contract years 2, 3 and 4).
