Convenience Store Ordinance Update

Timeline

OB

- **September 12, 2011** ∼ Ordinance goes into effect
- **September 14, 2011** ∼ 42 stores notified of requirements
- November 11, 2011 ~ All Convenience Stores required to be in compliance with the ordinance.

Store Facts

- There were a total of 156 confirmed Convenience Stores in 2011
- Of those stores, 42 were required to meet all security requirements of the Ordinance
- ™ In 2013 the total number of stores was 159
- ≈ 10 of those stores have closed leaving a 2014 total of 149
- With closures and new openings, we now have 40 stores that are required to meet all of the security requirements
- 3 additional stores are now over the benchmark

Positive Outcomes

- A majority of the stores are in compliance
- ⊠ Better communication and working relationship
 with stores and Police
- Registration information directs Police to work with actual decision makers

Calls For Service (CFS) Comparison

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○ 2010* (No Ordinance)
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- CFS = 2,869
- CFS 2-6 a.m. = 242
- \bigcirc Arrests = 504
- Citywide CFS = 4,237
 - Convenience Stores Only

- CFS = 1.894
- CFS 2-6 a.m. = 23
- \bigcirc Arrests = 672
- Citywide CFS = 2,958
 - Convenience Stores Only

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    % of Change 2010 - 2014
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- CFS = 34% Decrease
- **CFS 2-6 a.m. = 90% Decrease**
- Arrests = 33% Increase
- Citywide CFS = 30% Decrease
 - Convenience Stores Only

Stakeholder Meetings

- On-Line Reporting concerns were addressed in a meeting with Arizona Food Marketing Alliance
- On-Line Reporting protocols were forwarded to all Convenience Store Stakeholders and two trainings were held
- Additional meeting with Police, Mesa Prevention Alliance, Arizona Food Marketing Alliance (AFMA), and City Attorney Staff was held on April 16, 2014
 - Reassessing stores every two years was agreed upon
 - AFMA had two issues
 - They would like stores to be able to be removed from the list based on Calls for Service assessments
 - They would like the requirement for lighting at the dumpsters to be removed
- Mesa Police and Arizona Food Marketing Alliance and Mesa Prevention Alliance are in agreement with the proposed changes to update Mesa City Ordinance #5056

Major Issues

- Current Ordinance does not allow the addition of stores whose four year average Calls For Service (CFS) have spiked
- Ruture reassessment of stores
- Recommended clarification and changes to the ordinance

Recommended Clarification & Changes

- Wording change of the ordinance:
 - For Clarification/Simplification
 - ☑ To Provide Consistency/Reduce Chance of Misinterpretation
 - Ordinance needs to be subdivided for proper notice of violation
 - Needs amendment to be consistent with other city code chapters
- **Examples**:
 - **Signage**
 - ☑ Definition of "Remodel"
 - Violations; Penalties

Continued: Recommended Clarification & Changes

- Wording change of the ordinance Lighting at Refuse Area:
 - The exterior refuse area must meet one (1) of the three (3) options
- Adding and removing stores from requirements:
 - Agreed to reassessing all stores every 2 years beginning in 2015
 - Stores with a 30 or more 4 year average CFS remain
 - Stores under a 30 CFS 4 year average drop off
 - Stores going back over 30 after they have dropped off will go back on permanently.
