Subject: Environmental Compliance Fee Update

Purpose and Recommendation

The purpose of this report is to provide an update of the Environmental Compliance Fee for the FY 15/16 budget.

Background

The Environmental Compliance Fee is a set amount applied to each utility account customer to meet the projected costs of Federal and State environmental mandates. The current rate is \$7.32 per month per account. If a customer has multiple services at the same location, the fee is applied only once.

Discussion

The current fee is estimated to generate \$14.8 million in revenue in FY15/16. The fee funds the city's environmental activities such as air quality, storm water quality, hazardous waste management, and asbestos management.

There are about 43 full-time equivalent positions allocated to the Environmental Compliance Fund. These include various positions such as basin maintenance workers, equipment operators for street sweepers, inspectors, support staff, etc. The following is a breakdown of the FY 14/15 budget, the FY 15/16 proposed budget, and the FY 15/16 full-time equivalent (FTE) position count:

The FY 15/16 proposed budget includes a one-time expense of \$1.0 million to replace many water pumps in retention basins. Also included is \$1.7 million in expenses carried over from FY 14/15. The significant items carried over include an additional \$1.0 million for additional water pumps and \$300,000 for wash racks. The on-going expense budget for FY 15/16 is \$14.4 million. No adjustments are recommended for the fee amount. The on-going proposed budget for the Environmental Fee Fund is consistent with the FY 14/15 budget.
