## **Purpose and Recommendation**

The City of Mesa Fire and Medical Department is respectfully requesting that the Mesa City Council authorize the City Manager or his designee to approve and execute a Subgrantee Agreement with the Arizona Department of Homeland Security. The Agreement provides \$78,500 to the Mesa Fire and Medical Department for the Terrorism Liaison Officer program (TLO) for equipment.

## **Background**

The United States Department of Homeland Security (USDOHS) through the Arizona Department of Homeland Security (AZDOHS) Grant Program provides grant funding to support areas of equipment, training exercise and planning to support a response to a terrorist incident and aid in the prevention of such events. The AZDOHS 2015 Homeland Security Grant Program has identified funds for the City of Mesa Fire and Medical Department of \$78,500. If approved, the funding will be used to support the City's ability to prevent and respond to acts of terrorism.

#### **Discussion**

The Mesa Fire and Medical Department Terrorism Liaison Officer is part of the Phoenix Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI). The project will allow Mesa Fire and Medical Department to increase the capability of the Terrorism Liaison Officer's in their performance mission. The 2015 UASI TLO grant will equip and purchase an additional vehicle to enhance our response capabilities.

### **Alternatives**

If the Subgrantee Agreement is not approved, the funding will remain with the State to be distributed to other Valley agencies resulting in a loss of funding for the Mesa Fire and Medical Department TLO program.

## **Fiscal Impact**

The award amount is \$78,500 and no match is required. Approving the use of these grant funds will allow the City of Mesa to accept grant funding allocated to the sustainment of the Terrorism Liaison Officer.

#### **Coordinated With**

This grant funding will be managed through the Mesa Fire and Medical Department and they are in support of this resolution.
