A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER IN TO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE SALT RIVER PIMA-MARICOPA INDIAN COMMUNITY FOR THE RECEIPT AND DISTRIBUTION OF PROPOSITION 202 FUNDS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: Arizona's Indian Gaming Compact provides that an Indian Tribe make twelve percent (12%) of its net annual State contribution to cities, towns or counties for government services that benefit the general public.

<u>Section 2</u>: The Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community wishes to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Mesa to receive and distribute \$575,375.00 from its 2015 12% revenues for grants as follows:

- \$50,000.00 to **A New Leaf** for services provided to families by the La Mesita Family Emergency Homeless Shelter.
- \$ 20,000.00 to the **Boy Scouts of America-Grand Canyon Council** to fund the Scouting outreach programs of Scouting through Soccer, Juvenile Diversion, Foster Care Mentoring, After School Intervention and New Unit Development, which will make it possible for more young people to benefit from these programs.
- \$ 40,000.00 to the **Gene Lewis Boxing Club** for the "Saving Futures, One Child at a Time" program. The program operates in a high-crime, low-income area of Mesa, Arizona and serves students from across the East Valley
- \$270,375.00 to the City of Mesa for the Mesa Fire and Medical Department Immunization Program, Mesa Police Department for the Bike Unit and for Forensics Storage Solutions, Mesa Parks, Recreation and Commercial Facilities for Jacinto Retention Basin development, Mesa Counts on College for PSAT & SAT Testing, and the Mesa Dobson Library MakerSpace.
- \$ 70,000.00 to **Veterans Medical Leadership** for the Returning Warrior Fund, which provides financial assistance for rent, utilities, transportation, food and other needs not provided by the Federal or State government.
- \$125,000.00 to the **United Food Bank** for Emergency and Supplemental Food Program to help support all of our Kids' L.I.F.E. and Food link.

<u>Section 3</u>: The City Council supports these grants and authorizes the City Manager, or his designee, to enter into the proposed Intergovernmental Agreement with the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community to accept and administer the 2015 awarded Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community Proposition 202 funding.
