## **Purpose and Recommendation**

The City Council previously adopted, and the Mesa Municipal Court implemented a Municipal Court Sustainability Fee in the amount of (\$15.00) assessed and collected on a per/charge basis. The Sustainability Fee enhances and maintains the technological, operational, and security capabilities of the Municipal Court. The purpose of this report is to seek approval to clarify applicable provisions of the City Code regarding the Municipal Court Sustainability Fee.

# **Background**

The Mesa Municipal Court has employed extensive use of technology for operational efficiencies and in providing web-services for the public. The Mesa Municipal Court is recognized as a national model by the National Center for State Courts, and the Sustainability Fee supports the continued use and expansion of technology in fulfilling the Court's mission and service to the public.

#### **Discussion**

A recent routine operational review by the Arizona Supreme Court confirmed that the Court appropriately assessed and collected the Sustainability Fee, but suggested that the City Code should be revised to more clearly reflect that the Sustainability Fee is assessed on a per/charge basis.
