Subject: Approving and authorizing the City Manager to enter into a First

Amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, and any subsequent amendments thereto, for the receipt and distribution of additional Proposition 202 funds received during the City's 2017-2018 fiscal year, to be used for City services or passed-through to local agency programs. (Citywide)

Purpose and Recommendation

The requested resolution will authorize the City Manager to sign a first amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of the City of Mesa with the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRP-MIC) to receive an additional \$100,000.00 in proposition 202 funds to be used for city departments' services and additional funding in the amount of \$250,000 to be passed-through to local agencies, as well as the potential of additional funding at a later date.

Background

Proposition 202, passed with the 2002 Gaming Compact in Arizona, directs participating Tribal Governments to share 12% of their gaming revenues with surrounding local governments.

On October 2, 2017, through Resolution No. 11042.17, the City Council accepted and agreed to distribute \$1,080,000.00 In Proposition 202 Funds for use by City of Mesa departments and community use programs.

Discussion

The SRP-MIC has elected to distribute an additional amount of \$100,000 to the City of Mesa, an additional \$250,000 to Mesa Public Schools, and add an additional award for the Boys and Girls Club at a later date. SRP-MIC does not require a resolution of support for applicants to apply for funding. However, the City must first enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with SRP-MIC for the receipt and use of funds.

Alternatives

The only alternative to authorizing this Intergovernmental agreement is to deny it. Such action would negate the city's ability to accept the additional Prop 202 funds.

Fiscal Impact

Acceptance of this funding will add \$350,000 in grant funds at this time to city services and local agency programs. This equates to a positive fiscal impact for the city.
