**Subject:** 17-Month Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Vector

Services for the Water Resources Department (Citywide)

## Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the award as recommended.

The Water Resources Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the Pima County cooperative contract with Peoria Pest Control, Inc., at \$129,000.

## **Background / Discussion**

This contract will provide manhole cockroach control services for Water Resources – Wastewater Collections Division to proactively treat up to one third (approximately 10,000) of the City's manholes with insecticide every year. In the past the City has only been able to provide reactive services by sending a crew out to spray manholes after receiving customer complaints. Wastewater Collections does not have the manpower or equipment to proactively treat the City's manholes. The manhole insecticide will have a 2-year warranty.

The Pima County cooperative contract has been competitively bid and provides for the lowest possible cooperative pricing. Many other cities use this cooperative contract including City of Glendale, City of Chandler and City of Tempe. This contract will allow the City of Mesa to get a contractor started immediately for proactive treatment. Pima County treats many more manholes per year than City of Mesa therefore we are leveraging their volume discount by using their contract.
