## **Purpose and Recommendation**

The City of Mesa Fire and Medical Department is respectfully requesting that the Mesa City Council authorize the City Manager or his designee enter into a Subrecipient Agreement with the Arizona Department of Homeland Security. The Agreement provides \$33,010 to the Mesa Fire and Medical Department for the Metropolitan Medical Response Systems (MMRS) for equipment.

#### Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security (USDOHS) through the Arizona Department of Homeland Security (AZDOHS) Grant Program provides grant funding to support areas of equipment, training exercise and planning to support a response to a terrorist incident and large scale disaster. The AZDOHS 2018 Homeland Security Grant Program has identified funds for the City of Mesa Fire and Medical Department of \$33,010 for equipment to maintain the MMRS Cache deployed in the event of a large scale mass casualty incident. If approved, the funding will be used to support the City's ability to prevent and respond to acts of terrorism.

## Discussion

The Mesa Fire and Medical Department is one of four designated MMRS jurisdictions in the state of Arizona. As a statewide asset we work very closely with our surrounding partners to build a cache of equipment and resources that are able to work seamlessly together on large scale mass casualty events. As funding to maintain these assets has decreased, we have utilized a regional approach to find cost savings. This has allowed us to maintain this capability.

#### Alternatives

If the Subrecipient Agreement is not approved, the funding will remain with the State to be distributed to other valley agencies. This will result in a loss of funding for the Mesa Fire and Medical Department Metropolitan Medical Response Systems program.

# **Fiscal Impact**

The award amount is \$33,010 and no match is required. Approving the use of these grant funds will allow the City of Mesa to accept grant funding allocated to the sustainment of the Metropolitan Medical Response Systems.

This grant funding will be managed through the Mesa Fire and Medical Department and they are in support of this resolution.
