Subject:	Subrecipient Agreement with the Arizona Department of Homeland Security, Police Department Terrorism Liaison Program Sustainment (Citywide)

#### **Purpose and Recommendation**

The City of Mesa Police Department is respectfully requesting the Mesa City Council authorize the City Manager or his designee to enter into a Subrecipient Agreement with the Arizona Department of Homeland Security to accept \$88,100 in grant funds for equipment, reoccurring subscriptions and training for the Police Department's Terrorism Liaison Program.

## Background

This project provides funding to continue the Police Department's Terrorism Liaison Program which integrates information sharing and dissemination by promoting collaboration among Federal, State, Tribal and local law enforcement agencies to protect public and private key resources and critical infrastructure.

#### Discussion

The Mesa Police Department's Terrorism Liaison Program is designed to provide the region with an all-hazards response capability. To be effective, the Terrorism Liaison Program needs to have the efficient equipment for the various incidents they may encounter. Funding from this award will be used for equipment, reoccurring subscriptions and training.

#### Alternatives

If this Subrecipient Agreement is not approved, the funding will remain with the State to be distributed to other Valley agencies. The Mesa Police Department's Homeland Security Unit will not purchase additional equipment or attend various training events.

## **Fiscal Impact**

The award amount is \$88,100 and no match is required. Mesa Police Department personnel will be responsible for submitting invoices on a quarterly basis to the Arizona Department of Homeland Security. The Arizona Department of Homeland Security will remit monies due upon receipt of the invoices.
