Subject:	21-Month Term Contract with Three Years of Renewal Options for Uniform Garment Rentals for Various City Departments as requested by the Business Services Department (Citywide)

## Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the award as recommended.

The Business Services Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the National IPA / City of Tucson cooperative contract with Prudential Overall Supply at \$304,000 annually with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

## **Background / Discussion**

This contract provides uniform garments rental to approximately 300 City employees from Mesa Fire and Medical, Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities (PRCF), Transportation, Fleet Services, Environmental Management and Sustainability, Water Resources and Energy Resources. The garments furnished by the contractor will be maintained through routine laundering, pressing and repairing to provide a neat and clean appearance for City personnel.

City staff and Purchasing met and reviewed multiple uniform rental contracts/vendors which were not competitive in comparison to the City of Tucson cooperative contract. Tucson's contract meets City of Mesa's procurement requirements, has been competitively bid, and allows for cooperative use. The City has been successful in using other City of Tucson contracts through National IPA cooperative contract program.
