Subject: Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Grant Program - Citywide

Purpose and Recommendation

The City of Mesa Police Department is respectfully requesting the Mesa City Council authorize the City Manager or his designee to enter into a Pedestrian and Bicyclist Sub-Grantee Cooperative Agreement with the Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety to accept \$30,000 in grant funds. The funds will be used by the Police Department's Traffic Division for overtime, employee related expenses and supplies for pedestrian and bicycle safety throughout the City of Mesa.

Background

Pedestrians crossing outside of the crosswalk and against traffic lights, and bicyclists traveling against traffic is a large problem. In the first eleven months of 2018, the City of Mesa experienced 8 pedestrian and 2 bicyclist fatalities. In an effort to reduce these types of fatalities, funds will be used for education and enforcement.

Discussion

The Police Department will educate pedestrians, bicyclists and drivers by:

- Conducting focused operations to increase the educational and enforcement contacts of pedestrian and bicyclists.
- Partnering with local advocacy groups to reach the homeless population.
- Conducting a social media campaign on pedestrian and bicycle safety.
- Partnering with School Resource Officers on pedestrian and bicycle safety.

Alternatives

If this Agreement is declined, the Mesa Police Department will be limited in the pedestrian and bicycle safety enforcement and educational programs.

Fiscal Impact

Funds will be used for Supplies, Personnel Services (Overtime) and Employee Related Expenses (ERE) for pedestrian and bicycle safety throughout the City. The maximum reimbursement for employee benefits is 40%, the costs of the unreimbursed expenses for benefits will be \$3,187. Funding for this expense will be absorbed by the Police Department operating budget.

Mesa Police Department personnel will be responsible for submitting reports on a quarterly basis to the Governor's Office of Highway Safety. The Governor's Office of Highway Safety will remit monies due upon receipt of the invoices.

Coordinated With

The City of Mesa Police Department recommends the approval of the Governor's Office of Highway Safety Pedestrian and Bicyclist Sub-Grantee Cooperative Agreement.
