Subject: One-Year Renewal to the Term Contract for Fabrication and Installation of Park Signs for the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department
(Citywide)

Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the contract renewal as recommended.

The Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the renewal with Sierra Signs & Service, Inc. (a Mesa business) at \$467,000.00 annually, based on estimated quantities.

Background / Discussion

The Parks, Recreation and Commercial Facilities (PRCF) Department uses park identification signs, basin identification signs, rules signs, and other signs throughout the City's Parks system for park identification and to inform and assist patrons in the proper use of Park properties.

This contract provides for the fabrication and installation of new standard identification and rules signs at City parks and facilities. New signs update the look and wording to create a more modern and consistent message. Changes in the City Code pertaining to Park regulations have been incorporated and standardized across all PRCF facilities. The old signs are removed at the time of new sign installations. This contract is necessary. It is necessary for maintaining, fabricating

Sierra Signs & Service, Inc., agreed to renew the contract under the same terms, conditions and current pricing. Rebidding this contract would likely expose the City to higher prices for these services. The City has been satisfied with the vendor's performance. This contract continues to be advantageous to the City and it is in the City's best interest to renew the contract.
