Subject: Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for

Miscellaneous Rescue Equipment for the Mesa Fire and Medical Department

(Citywide)

Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the award as recommended.

The Mesa Fire and Medical Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive and responsible bidders: Extrication Concepts; L.N. Curtis & Sons; and Municipal Emergency Services; at \$450,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or based on the Consumer Price Index.

Background / Discussion

Mesa Fire and Medical Department (MFMD) has standardized with two different kinds of rescue type equipment and carries miscellaneous small equipment and rescue tools on each apparatus (Holmatro and Genesis). This equipment has been selected by a committee and has been standardized. The rescue equipment meets or exceeds NFPA 1936 recommended standards.

This contract will provide battery powered extrication tools. Extrication tools are required for all hazardous response. These tools will replace outdated hydraulic extrication tools on existing apparatus and equip new apparatus.

Awards are being recommended to the lowest, responsive and responsive bidders of each Item.
