A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT PROPOSITION 202 FUNDS FROM THE SALT RIVER PIMA-MARICOPA INDIAN COMMUNITY AND ADMINSTER AWARDED FUNDS AS PASS-THROUGH GRANTS TO DESIGNATED AWARDEES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Arizona's Indian Gaming Compact provides that an Indian Tribe make twelve percent (12%) of its net annual State contribution to cities, towns or counties for government services that benefit the general public. Private, not-for-profit organizations wishing to access Indian Gaming Funds ("Gaming Funds") to provide public benefits must secure sponsorship from a city, town or county before making application. This sponsorship must be expressed in a resolution passed by the local government sponsor.

<u>Section 2</u>: The Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community wishes the City of Mesa to receive and distribute \$1,695,000 from its 2019 12% revenues for grants as follows:

\$800,000.00 to the **City of Mesa** for 15 programs identified for funding. Fire and Medical programs, Housing, Parks and Recreation, Police, City Manager, and the Arts.

\$100,000.00 to **A New Leaf** for shelter and support services at the five shelter programs.

\$500,000.00 to **Mesa Public Schools.** A grant will fund for two years, programs in four areas.

\$75,000.00 to the **Child Crisis Center** for Family Education/Safe Kids Maricopa Program.

\$75,000.00 to **Bogden House** for CMC Dignity Care Program.

\$20,000.00 to **Visit Mesa** for Digital Marketing Campaign directed at prospective family visitors.

\$125,000.00 to the **United Food Bank** for Mobile Pantry Emergency & Supplemental Food Assistance Program, Kids L.I.F.E. on site school pantry.

<u>Section 3</u>: The City Council supports these grants and authorizes the City Manager, or his designee, to accept and administer the 2019 awarded Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Proposition 202 funding.
