BACKGROUND







BACKGROUND

- 1996: Voters approved no-smoking in public places and certain places of employment.
- 2006: Smoke-free Arizona Act approved.
- 2007: Vaping devices entered U.S. market; by 2014 common place.
- 2013:Arizona prohibited purchase of vaping products for those under 18yrs.
- 2019: National news reported deaths and lung injuries, that may be linked to use of vaping devices; also growing concerns about rise in vaping usage by youth as well as passive exposure to second-hand aerosols.

PURPOSE

Based on community concerns, update existing "Smoke-free Environment Ordinance" to include "vaping" and "vaping devices" that are available in today's market.

RECOMMENDATION

- Amend existing ordinance to add a prohibition of vaping or use of vaping products on:
 - City property, public facilities and spaces; and
 - At certain places of employment, including bars, restaurants and grocery stores.
- Enable new rules to go into effect six months after (June 9, 2020) to allow for a public information campaign.
