

COUNCIL MINUTES

May 25, 2017

The City Council of the City of Mesa met in a Study Session in the lower level meeting room of the Council Chambers, 57 East 1st Street, on May 25, 2017 at 7:30 a.m.

Mayor Giles excused Councilmember Winkle from the entire meeting.

1-a. Hear a presentation, discuss and provide direction on funding recommendations for the FY 2017-18 and prior years' available funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Human Services Programs.

Director of Housing and Community Development Elizabeth Morales introduced Community Revitalization Coordinator Dennis Newburn who displayed a PowerPoint presentation (See Attachment 1) related to funding recommendations for the FY 2017-18 and prior years' available funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Human Services Programs.

Ms. Morales reviewed the following purpose and recommendations (See Page 2 of Attachment 1):

- Allocation of federal and local dollars for FY 2017/18
- Recommend funding for the CDBG, HOME, ESG, and Human Services programs

Ms. Morales displayed the estimated Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocations for FY 2017/18. She pointed out that some funding sources have caps and limits on funding and are noted. She highlighted that the funding source for Human Services has a carryover amount of \$60,000 from FY 2016/17 to FY 2017/18 to assist in projects not covered with the FY 2017/18 funds. Ms. Morales stated that 72 applications for funding were submitted totaling approximately \$8 million and explained the funding process. (See Pages 4 through 6 of Attachment 1)

Ms. Morales reviewed the program recommendations, noted that the contingency amount for the CDBG fund is for emergencies such as flooding, and that the ESG program is specific to assisting the homeless. (See Pages 8 through 12 of Attachment 1)

Ms. Morales requested Council direction on the funding recommendations.

Mayor Giles thanked the Housing and Community Development Department and everyone who participated in this process.

Vice Mayor Luna thanked staff for their hard work and thanked all of the Non-Profit organizations for their contributions to the community.

It was moved by Vice Mayor Luna, seconded by Councilmember Glover, to approve the recommendations for the FY 2017-18 and prior years' available funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Human Services Programs as recommended by staff.

Mayor Giles declared the motion carried unanimously by those present.
