

#### **COUNCIL MINUTES**

February 7, 2019

The City Council of the City of Mesa met in a Study Session in the lower level meeting room of the Council Chambers, 57 East 1st Street, on February 7, 2019 at 7:30 a.m.

Mayor Giles excused Councilmember Duff from the entire meeting.

1. Review items on the agenda for the February 11, 2019 Regular Council meeting.

All of the items on the agenda were reviewed among Council and staff and the following was noted:

Conflict of interest: None.

Items removed from the consent agenda: None.

2-a. Hear a presentation, discuss, and provide direction on the proposed 5-year implementation plan and schedule for the 2018 General Obligation Bond projects for parks and recreation, cultural, and public safety.

Office of Management and Budget Coordinator Scott Butler displayed a PowerPoint presentation. (See Attachment 1) He commented that a bond authorization is a multi-year project that can take several years.

Mr. Butler explained that the expenditures provided are estimates and added that each implementation is displayed by Fiscal Year (FY). (See Pages 3 through 8 of Attachment 1)

Mr. Butler provided Council with a detailed 2018 General Obligation Project Schedule for their review. (See Attachment 2)

Mr. Butler highlighted land acquisition projects already in progress. He noted that the Northeast Public Safety Facility is a joint substation for the Police and Fire and Medical Departments. He clarified that the Public Safety communication fiber project is to close some of the gaps with other

ongoing projects by connecting to the communication fiber. He noted that the main focus will be in downtown. (See Page 3 of Attachment 1)

In response to a question posed by Mayor Giles, City Manager Christopher Brady responded that fiber and conduit are installed by the City and a commercial business can rent the conduit space from the City.

In response to a question from Councilmember Luna, Mr. Butler confirmed that the Engineering Department is working with the i.d.e.a. Museum on design and conceptual drawings. He added that the conceptual drawings will assist with additional fundraising. (See Page 4 of Attachment 1)

Mr. Brady explained that when the conceptual drawings are completed, a gap will occur prior to the beginning of construction in order for the i.d.e.a. Museum to hold fundraisers. He stated construction is scheduled to begin in FY 2022/23.

Mr. Butler pointed out that by FY 2022/23 all design work will be completed with only construction remaining on the bond projects. (See Pages 7 and 8 of Attachment 1)

Mr. Butler stated that the Fire Apparatus Replacement schedule has \$24.7 million in funding for FY 2019/20 through FY 2022/23 and that when the Fire and Medical Department is determining the replacement schedule they consider mileage and years in service of the equipment. (See Page 9 of Attachment 1)

In response to a question posed by Mayor Giles, Mr. Brady explained that the apparatus listed are large vehicles with a substantial purchase price such as the pumper and ladder trucks, whereas the cost of heavy-duty vehicles for medical response units would be financed through the City's sales tax revenue.

Mr. Butler highlighted the Operations and Maintenance (O&M) estimated costs which are separated between ongoing and start-up costs. (See page 12 of Attachment 1)

Mr. Brady commented that the O&M cost factors in with the timing of projects and whether or not the City is able to absorb the additional O&M costs. He added that the funds listed are above and beyond what the City has, however, the costs will be included in the annual budget review.

In response to a question from Councilmember Thompson, Mr. Brady responded that the construction timeline for the Police Evidence Facility meets the timeline for the Police Department in order to have adequate storage room. He stated that for Monterey Park, the timeline may change if the land acquisition occurs sooner.

In response to a question from Vice Mayor Freeman related to the office park development (Union), Mr. Brady reported that the Riverview District construction is in progress, however, the Development Agreement (DA) is not complete.

In response to a question posed by Councilmember Luna regarding the project schedule, Mr. Brady responded that since the bonds have been approved the City will deliver the projects. He stated that the City has accounted for an economic correction within the next two years and staff will be evaluating budget costs annually to determine the ability to maintain these projects in future years.

Mayor Giles thanked staff for the presentation.

3. Acknowledge receipt of minutes of various boards and committees.

It was moved by Councilmember Luna, seconded by Vice Mayor Freeman, that receipt of the above-listed minutes be acknowledged.

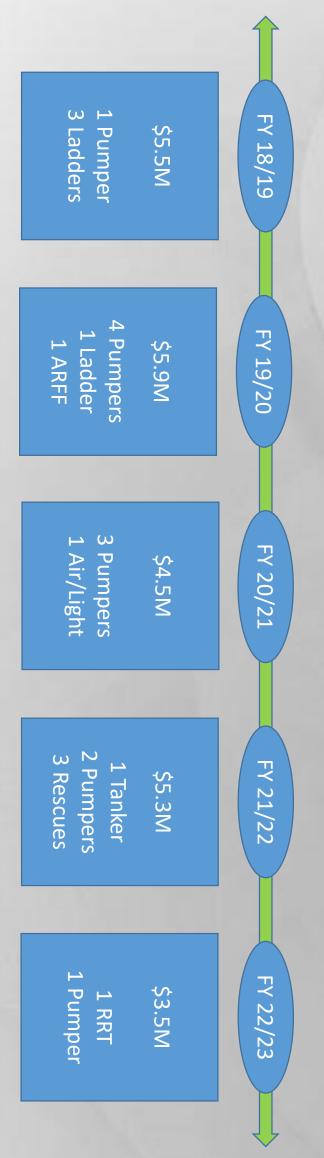

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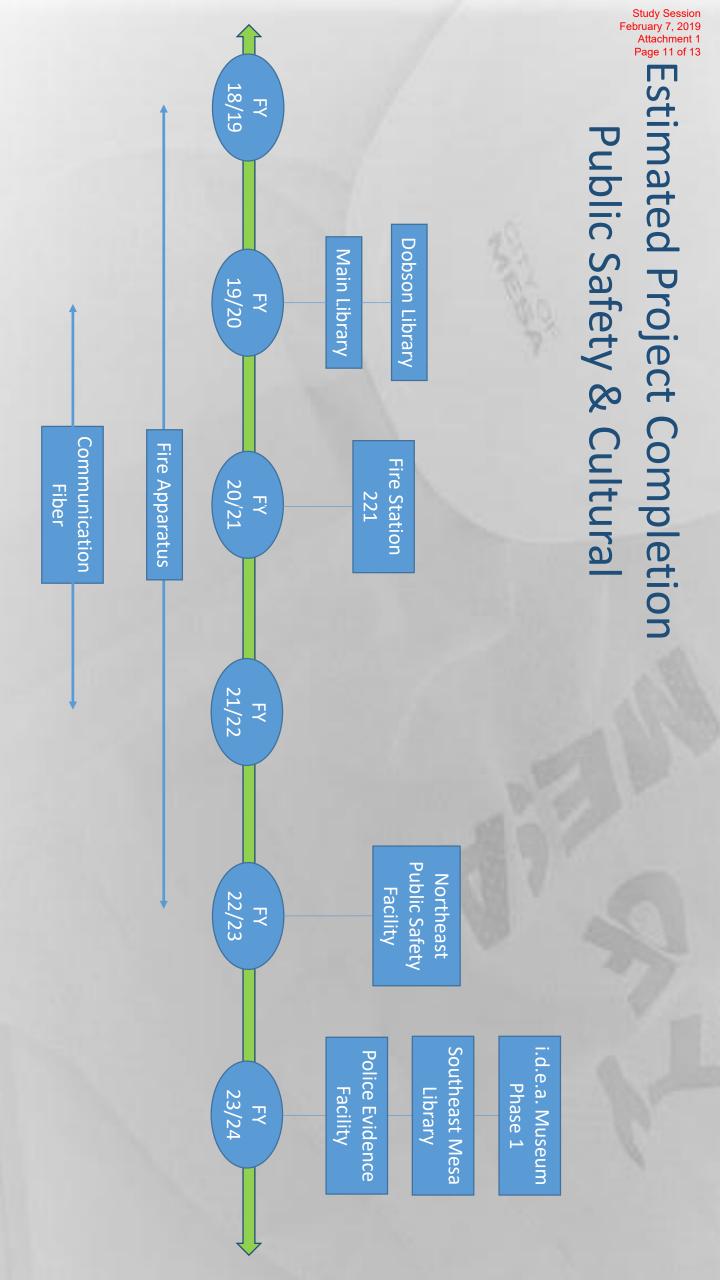
