Title: Approving and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community for the receipt and distribution of \$1,080,000 in Proposition 202 Funds. (Citywide)

Under this Agreement, \$500,000 is awarded to the following City of Mesa programs: Fire and Medical, Immunization Program (\$85,000); Police Department, Field Intelligence Officer Program Equipment (\$79,565), Making Every Student Accountable (\$14,181), and Computer Forensics Unit Training and Equipment (\$35,965); Mesa Counts on College, GED Program Expansion (\$35,289); Downtown Transformation, Downtown Façade Improvements (\$100,000); Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities, Kleinman Park Playground Renovation (\$100,000); and the i.d.e.a. Museum, Bolstering Child Development Through Creativity (\$50,000).

The balance of the funds will be distributed to other local community agencies, including A New Leaf, Child Crisis Center, Gene Lewis Boxing Club, Mesa Public Schools, Sojourner Center and the United Food Bank.
