For agendized items, comments should be relevant to the item being discussed. During "Items from Citizens Present," the speaker may address the City Council on more general issues. Councilmembers are normally not permitted to discuss or take legal action on any matters raised by the public that are not specifically on the agenda.

If you would like handouts distributed to the City Council, please give them to the City Clerk at the time you submit your blue speaker card. Eleven copies of each document is requested.

*4-a 23-0936 Purchase of a New Audio Console (Replacement) for the Arts and Culture Department (Citywide)

This purchase will replace the current audio consoles, accompanying processors, and peripherals at the Mesa Arts Center (MAC) Ikeda and Piper Theaters. This equipment is used for events and live performances. The MAC's current audio consoles are reaching their end of life and repair parts are no longer available.

The Arts and Culture Department - Mesa Arts Center and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidder, CTI dba Conference Technologies for \$214,305.29. This purchase is funded by the Mesa Arts Center Restoration Fund.

*4-b 23-0941 Cooperative Contract Use for the Purchase of Two Combination Sewer Vacuum Trucks (One Replacement and One Addition) for the Water Resources Department (Citywide)

This equipment will be used to support Wastewater Collection operations and maintenance activities to clean the City's sewer lines by vacuuming fat, oil, grease, grit, and debris that accumulates over time in the system. Ongoing maintenance of the City's sewer lines is necessary to mitigate public safety risks and sanitary sewer overflows. The replacement sewer truck will be replacing a unit that is beyond its useful life.

The Fleet Services and Water Resources Departments, and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the Sourcewell cooperative contract with AZ Wastewater Industries Inc. for \$1,127,719.54. This purchase is funded by the Utility Replacement Extension and Renewal Fund and Capital Utility Fund.

*4-c 23-0942

Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Landscaping and Decorative Rock Materials for various City Departments (as requested by the Transportation Department) (Citywide)

This contract will provide landscaping and decorative rock materials for the Transportation, Energy Resources, Water Resources, and Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities departments. These departments use the materials throughout the City in their daily operations.

The Transportation, Water Resources, Energy Resources, and Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Departments and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidders, Calmat Co. dba Vulcan Materials Co.; Green Dream International LLC; Material Delivery Inc.; and Red Mountain Mining Inc. (a Mesa business) at \$1,902,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Producer Price Index.

Cooperative Contract Use for the Purchase of Two Heavy-Duty Construction Trucks with Dump Bodies (Additions) for the Transportation Department (Citywide)

The two Freightliner dump trucks will be additions to Transportation's Field Operations. One truck will support the new concrete work group and the other truck will support the asphalt work group. The dump trucks have the capacity to haul material and heavy equipment to job sites. Additionally, these trucks are able to respond to storm-related emergencies to deliver equipment and haul sand and debris.

The Transportation and Fleet Services Departments and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the State of Arizona cooperative contract with Freightliner of Arizona, for \$601,189.62. This purchase is funded by the Local Streets Fund.

Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Vactor Services for the Transportation and Fleet Services Departments (Citywide)

This contract will provide vactor services to assist with maintaining the City's storm drain system. Vactor services remove sediment and debris from the storm drain lines allowing for drainage flow. Storm drain system maintenance is critical for reducing the likelihood of flooding during storms.

The Transportation and Fleet Services Departments and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidders for each Group, Kary Environmental Services Inc. (a Mesa business) and Pipeline Video Inspection LLC dba AIMS Companies at \$661,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.
