### Visual Arts Contest Topics (Kindergarten -12th grade)

Students can showcase their visual arts skills (submittals can include a video, sketch, painting, 3D model, etc.) and learn more about Mesa's history by submitting an art piece that falls within one of the following three topics:

- 1. What Makes Mesa Important to You?
- 2. A Historic Building or Sign in Mesa
- 3. A Historic Person/People of Mesa

### Essay Topics (4th-12th grade only)

Students can showcase their writing talents and learn more about Mesa's history by submitting an essay about one or more of the topics below. Contest entries must be a historical essay or fictional story on <u>one</u> of the following three topics:

- 1. Historic Athletes in Mesa
- 2. Places I Would Like to See in Mesa 50 Years From Now
- 3. What I Would Put in a Time Capsule from Mesa

### Submissions:

See the Entry Form for ways to submit your entries. All Submissions are due by March 22nd 2024.

### Eligibility\*:

ALL SCHOOL-AGE MESA RESIDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY!

Mesa students in kindergarten through 12th grade are eligible for the visual arts contest. Mesa students in 4th through 12th grade are eligible for the essay AND visual arts contest. \*All students must reside in the City of Mesa.

### Prizes:

Awards will be given to students and teachers in each category based on grade (K-3, 4-6, & 7-12). Additionally, schools will receive \$500 for each first-place winner. See the Awards section at the end of this document for more information.



### **Contest Regulations:**

All entries must comply with the following contest rules:

- 1. A completed submission form is required with all submissions (submission form at the end of this document).
- 2. Each entry must reflect the student's own research, writing, and original thinking.
- 3. Entries must be in the form of an essay or fictional story or visual arts (such as video, sketch, painting, scale model, etc.).
- 4. One (1) entry may be submitted by each contestant.
- 5. K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade students may only submit an art piece.
- 6. Students in 4th through 12th grade may submit either an essay or an art piece.
- 7. All sources must be properly cited.
- 8. Each entry should be no more than 750 words in length (essay), three minutes long (video), or 24" X 36" in size (visual arts project such as painting, sketch, or base size for 3D model).
- 9. Essays may be typed or neatly written.
- 10. The <u>title</u> of the essay, but NOT the author's name, MUST appear on the top of all pages of the essay. Each visual arts project MUST include a <u>title</u> using an index card, label, or other clear identifier.
- 11. All entries will become property of the Mesa Historic Preservation Board. The Board may reprint the essays in publications, online, or use them at workshops. Appropriate citations will be given to the authors.
- 12. Winning entries will be posted to the Historic Preservation Office website.

### Judging:

The Mesa Historic Preservation Board members will judge submissions on the historic information <u>included</u>, storytelling ability, and artistic expression appropriate for the grade level(s) (K-3, 4-6, & 7-12). They will then determine the top three winners for each age group and category based on the overall impression of the degree to which the story, video or visual arts project conveys Mesa's history.
