

## **Heat Relief One-Time \$89,800**

- ✓ Continuous demand for heat safety services
  - Dangerously high temperatures
  - Increased heat related deaths summer 2023 (51) to 2024 (65)
  - Reduced 211 heat transportation services in region
- ✓ Continue 3-year IGA
  - Central Mesa heat relief center
  - County ARPA for summer 2024, 2025, 2026
- ✓ Establish summer 2026 funding
  - Portable AC Loan Program
  - Dedicated heat safety transportation service
  - Continue collaboration with heat relief partners





## Street Outreach One-Time \$273,806 (\$301k CDBG)

- ✓ Supports Heat Relief, Public Safety, Mesa Libraries
- ✓ Continue successful Street Outreach Navigation Contract
  - FY 24/25 one-time funding approved
  - 6 navigators, vehicles, tool kits


