For agendized items, comments should be relevant to the item being discussed. During "Items from Citizens Present," the speaker may address the City Council on more general issues. Councilmembers are normally not permitted to discuss or take legal action on any matters raised by the public that are not specifically on the agenda.

If you would like handouts distributed to the City Council, please give them to the City Clerk at the time you submit your blue speaker card. Eleven copies of each document is requested.

This is a one-day event to be held on Saturday, October 21, 2023, from 4:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at 1551 East Dana Avenue. **(District 4)**

*3-b 23-0991 Phoenix Villains

This is a one-day event to be held on Saturday, October 21, 2023, from 4:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at Desert Wind Harley Davidson, 922 South Country Club Drive. (District 4)

A general merchandise retailer is requesting a new Series 10 Beer and Wine Store License for Family Dollar Inc., 1021 East Main Street - Anita Martinez, agent. There is no existing license at this location. **(District 4)**

Recommendation for Denial: The recommendation is for denial due to evidence that the best interests of the community will not be substantially served by issuing the license and the applicant has not obtained all necessary licenses and permits for which the applicant is eligible at the time of the liquor license application (Ariz. Admin. Code. § R19-1-702(A)). Specifically, the applicant has not obtained the following necessary license: General Business License, as required by Mesa City Code Title 5, Chapter 5. Additionally, the applicant has current debts related to accounts maintained with the City and is thus ineligible to receive a new license, service, or benefit from the City pursuant to Mesa City Code 1-32-200. Specifically, the applicant has the following debts related to accounts maintained with the City: (i) fees related to alarm systems as set forth in Mesa City Code Title 6, Chapter 15 and in the City's schedule of fees and charges; and (ii) fees related to fire safety operational permits as set forth in Mesa City Code Title 7, Chapter 2 and in the City's schedule of fees and charges. A yes vote for this item on the consent agenda will constitute City Council's order recommending disapproval of the liquor license application (Ariz. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 4-201 and Ariz. Admin. Code § R19-1-702).

4 Take action on the following contracts:

*4-a <u>23-0995</u>

Cooperative Contract Use for the 44-Month Term Contract with a One Year Renewal Option for Video Display/Scoreboard Maintenance and Repairs for the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department **(Citywide)**

This contract will provide for the maintenance and repair of the Daktronics electronic scoreboards at Hohokam Stadium and Sloan Park. All hardware and software required to maintain the scoreboards are included in the contract.

The Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the Sourcewell cooperative contract with Daktronics, Inc. at up to \$1,500,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

*4-b 23-1006 Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Fiberglass Waterslide and Water Feature Maintenance and Repairs for the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department (Citywide)

This contract will provide all labor, equipment, tools, materials, and all other items that are necessary to perform the waxing, buffing, and repair of the City's nine full-size fiberglass slides, two fiberglass kiddle slides, one cementitious/vinyl kiddle slide, eight splash pads, and pool facilities which contain water feature amenities.

An evaluation committee representing the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the highest scored proposal from AquaShield Products LLC dba SlideRenu at \$115,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

*4-c <u>23-1007</u> Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Genuine AC Delco and Motorcraft Parts for the Fleet Services Department (Citywide)

This contract will establish reliable sources for various Genuine AC Delco and Motorcraft parts used to support the maintenance and repair of the City of Mesa's fleet of vehicles.

The Fleet Services Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidders: Elliott Auto Supply dba Factory Motor Parts; and, USD Inc., at \$350,892 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Producer Price Index.

*4-d 23-1008 Dollar Limit Increase to the Term Contract for Rock and Concrete Materials for Various City Departments (Citywide)

This dollar limit increase is needed to process payments for the remaining invoices. Council approved the new contract award on August 28, 2023.

The Energy Resources, Water Resources, and Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Departments, and Purchasing recommend increasing the dollar limit with Fort McDowell Yavapai Materials; Material Delivery Inc.; and Arizona Metro Mix LLC by \$154,000, from \$950,000 to \$1,104,000.
