The City Council of the City of Mesa met in a Study Session in the lower level meeting room of the Council Chambers, 57 East 1st Street, on August 26, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.

1. Review and discuss items on the agenda for the August 26, 2019 Regular Council meeting.

All of the items on the agenda were reviewed among Council and staff and the following was noted:

2-a. Hear a presentation and discuss the new Neighborhood Leadership Program.

Community Services Director Ruth Giese introduced Community Services Coordinator Cynthia Ezcurra and Neighborhood Services Coordinator Lindsey Balinkie who displayed a PowerPoint presentation. (See Attachment 1)

Ms. Giese explained the focus of the program is building neighborhood leadership. She acknowledged the work being done by the Community Engagement Team in building Mesa leaders. She stated there are 575 registered neighborhoods, which all have different needs.

Ms. Ezcurra presented a multi-layer approach which was created to support the Neighborhood Leadership Program. (See Page 2 of Attachment 1)

Ms. Ezcurra stated a key component of the Neighborhood Leadership Program is the Resident's Guide to Mesa Series classes. She reported on the four classes in the series which will teach residents how to take care of their property and use City resources; supporting residents in taking leadership roles in their neighborhood; empowering residents to take action in the community; and living within a Homeowners Association (HOA). Ms. Ezcurra explained there is a comprehensive marketing campaign to invite residents and neighborhood leaders to participate in the classes and staff will be tracking the outcomes.

Ms. Balinkie highlighted the events and virtual support being offered. (See Page 4 of Attachment 1)

Ms. Balinkie reviewed the FY 19/20 proposed program menu and stated this is in addition to the normal services already being offered. She explained the working timeline for Fall 2019 and Spring 2020. (See Pages 5 and 6 of Attachment 1)

Councilmember Thompson commented on his desire in forming an advocacy group to find out what the issues are, to make the community better, and sharing information between districts.

In response to a question from Councilmember Luna regarding the outreach to Spanish-speaking residents, Ms. Ezcurra stated the classes will be offered in Spanish and accommodations will be provided.

Councilmember Duff stated she is willing to assist and will attend events to help with the outreach efforts.

In response to a comment by Vice Mayor Freeman, Ms. Ezcurra emphasized staff understands the needs of the neighborhoods and has a combined 24 years of experience working with Mesa neighborhoods.

City Manager Christopher Brady explained the difference between previous programs and the Neighborhood Leadership Program and stated this program is not limited to certain areas and involves residents as future leaders in their neighborhoods.

Mayor Giles thanked staff for the presentation.


