An evaluation committee recommend awarding the contract to the qualified proposal from Enterprise Holdings, Inc. at \$1,100,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

*4-b 25-0422 Eight-Month Term Use of a Cooperative Contract with Renewal Options for Sewer Inspection CCTV Equipment, Parts, and Services (Upgrade) for the Water Resources Department (Citywide)

The department's current CCTV inspection equipment is outdated and will no longer be supported by the vendor. Upgrading to an advanced Al-powered solution for sewer condition assessment is required to ensure a smooth transition to SewerAl, the City's underground infrastructure management system. This purchase will enable the modernization of hardware and robotics, enhancing operational efficiency and maintaining the effectiveness of our inspection processes.

The Water Resources Department and Procurement Services recommend authorizing the purchase using the Sourcewell cooperative contract with RapidView at \$500,000 annually with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

*4-c **25-0423**

One-Year Term Use of a Cooperative Contract with Renewal Options for Emergency Pipeline and Sewer Repair Services for the Water Resources Department (Citywide)

This contract provides for emergency pipeline and sewer repair services, which is crucial for water utilities to efficiently address unexpected pipeline failures or damage. Having pre-qualified contractors ensures prompt responses, reducing downtime and preventing disruptions in the water supply. Covered tasks typically include excavation, pipeline repairs, valve operations, and site restoration.

The Water Resources Department and Procurement Services recommend authorizing the purchase using the City of Scottsdale cooperative contract with WaCo, LLC. dba WaCo Contracting and Achen Gardner Construction, LLC at \$800,000, annually with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.
