September 18, 2023

The City Council of the City of Mesa met in a Regular Council Meeting in the Council Chambers, 57 East 1st Street, on September 18, 2023, at 5:45 p.m.

Vice Mayor's Welcome.

Vice Mayor Heredia conducted a roll call.

Vice Mayor Heredia excused Mayor Giles from the entire meeting.

Invocation by Pastor Luis Ochoa with First Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Pledge of Allegiance was led by Girl Scout Troop 3092.

Awards, Recognitions and Announcements.

Vice Mayor Heredia recognized Gary Cherms of the American Legion for gifting seven Missing in Action (MIA) and Prisoner of War (POW) flags which have been added to all City facilities that fly the US flag, including the Council Chambers.

Vice Mayor Heredia introduced Library Director Polly Bonnett, Marketing and Community Specialists, Sara Lipich and Veronica Coronado from the Mesa Public Library to recognize the nine winners of the Bike to Books Contest.

# 4. Take action on the following contracts:

\*4-a. Cooperative Contract Use for the 44-Month Term Contract with a One Year Renewal Option for Video Display/Scoreboard Maintenance and Repairs for the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department. (Citywide)

This contract will provide for the maintenance and repair of the Daktronics electronic scoreboards at Hohokam Stadium and Sloan Park. All hardware and software required to maintain the scoreboards are included in the contract.

The Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the Sourcewell cooperative contract with Daktronics, Inc. at up to \$1,500,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

\*4-b. Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Fiberglass Waterslide and Water Feature Maintenance and Repairs for the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department. (Citywide)

This contract will provide all labor, equipment, tools, materials, and all other items that are necessary to perform the waxing, buffing, and repair of the City's nine full-size

fiberglass slides, two fiberglass kiddie slides, one cementitious/vinyl kiddie slide, eight splash pads, and pool facilities which contain water feature amenities.

An evaluation committee representing the Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the highest scored proposal from AquaShield Products LLC dba SlideRenu at \$115,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

\*4-c. Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for Genuine AC Delco and Motorcraft Parts for the Fleet Services Department. (Citywide)

This contract will establish reliable sources for various Genuine AC Delco and Motorcraft parts used to support the maintenance and repair of the City of Mesa's fleet of vehicles.

The Fleet Services Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive, and responsible bidders: Elliott Auto Supply dba Factory Motor Parts; and, USD Inc., at \$350,892 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5%, or the adjusted Producer Price Index.

\*4-d. Dollar Limit Increase to the Term Contract for Rock and Concrete Materials for Various City Departments. (Citywide)

This dollar limit increase is needed to process payments for the remaining invoices. Council approved the new contract award on August 28, 2023.

The Energy Resources, Water Resources, and Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities Departments, and Purchasing recommend increasing the dollar limit with Fort McDowell Yavapai Materials; Material Delivery Inc.; and Arizona Metro Mix LLC by \$154,000, from \$950,000 to \$1,104,000.

  - \*5-b. ZON22-00835 "Mason Farms." (**District 1**) Within the 1200 to 1400 blocks of East Lehi Road (south side). Located south of East Lehi Road and east of North Stapley Drive (15± acres). Rezone from Single-Residence-43 (RS-43) to Single-Residence-43 with a Planned Area Development overlay (RS-43-PAD). This will allow for a single residence subdivision. Mason Farms LLC, applicant and owner. Ordinance No. 5811

\*5-c. ZON23-00222 "Brightpath Child Care." (**District 1**) Within the 1200 block of North Val Vista Drive (west side) and within the 3500 block of East Brown Road (north side). Located west of Val Vista Drive and north of Brown Road (1.2± acres). Rezone from Office Commercial with a Bonus Intensity Zone overlay (OC-BIZ) to Office Commercial (OC) and Major Site Plan Modification. This request will allow for the development of a day care center. Sean Lake, Pew and Lake PLC, applicant; Mark Reeb, Makana LP, owner. - Ordinance No. 5812

(**District 6**) Located along the South 80th Street Alignment and East Sebring Avenue Alignment, and within the 4500 block of the South Hawes Road Alignment, south of Warner Road (6.3± acres). EastGroup Properties Inc., developer; Sandy Hayden, HilgartWilson LLC, surveyor.
- \*6-c. SUB23-00458 "Map of Dedication for Hawes Crossing Village 1, Phase 2." (**District 6**) Located along the North 82nd Street Alignment and East Pratt Avenue Alignment, north of Elliot Road and west of Hawes Road (1± acres). Lennar Homes Inc., developer; Sandy Hayden, HilgartWilson LLC, surveyor.
- \*6-d. SUB22-01040 "Avalon Crossing Phase 2." (**District 6**) Within the 10100 to 10600 blocks of East Williams Field Road (south side) and within the 6000 to 6400 block of South 222nd Street (west side). Located east of Crismon Road on the south side of Williams Field Road (51.9± acres). Shea Homes Limited Partnership, developer; CVL Consultants, surveyor.
- \*6-e. SUB22-01041 "Map of Dedication of Avalon Crossing Phase 2." (**District 6**) Located along the South 222<sup>nd</sup> Street alignment, within the 10100 to 10600 blocks of East Williams Field Road (south side) and within the 6000 to 6400 block of South 222<sup>nd</sup> Street (west side). Located east of Crismon Road on the south side of Williams Field Road (0.4± acres). Shea Homes Limited Partnership, developer; CVL Consultants, surveyor.
- \*6-f. SUB22-01184 "Fusion at Avalon Crossing Replat." (**District 6**) Within the 10100 to 10600 blocks of East Williams Field Road (south side) and within the 6000 to 6400 block of South 222nd Street (west side). Located east of Crismon Road on the south side of Williams Field Road (12.7± acres). Shea Homes Limited Partnership, developer; CVL Consultants, surveyor.

#### Items not on the Consent Agenda

#### 3-d. Family Dollar #25078

A general merchandise retailer is requesting a new Series 10 Beer and Wine Store License for Family Dollar Inc., 1021 East Main Street - Anita Martinez, agent. There is no existing license at this location. **(District 4)** 

Recommendation for Denial: The recommendation is for denial due to evidence that the best interests of the community will not be substantially served by issuing the license and the applicant has not obtained all necessary licenses and permits for which the applicant is eligible at the time of the liquor license application (Ariz. Admin. Code. §

R19-1-702(A)). Specifically, the applicant has not obtained the following necessary license: General Business License, as required by Mesa City Code Title 5, Chapter 5. Additionally, the applicant has current debts related to accounts maintained with the City and is thus ineligible to receive a new license, service, or benefit from the City pursuant to Mesa City Code 1-32-200. Specifically, the applicant has the following debts related to accounts maintained with the City: (i) fees related to alarm systems as set forth in Mesa City Code Title 6, Chapter 15 and in the City's schedule of fees and charges; and (ii) fees related to fire safety operational permits as set forth in Mesa City Code Title 7, Chapter 2 and in the City's schedule of fees and charges. A yes vote for this item on the consent agenda will constitute City Council's order recommending disapproval of the liquor license application (Ariz. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 4-201 and Ariz. Admin. Code § R19-1-702).

It was moved by Councilmember Duff, seconded by Councilmember Freeman, that the application for Family Dollar #25078 be forwarded to the State Liquor Board with a recommendation for denial.
