### **Purpose and Recommendation**

The requested resolution will authorize the City Manager to enter into a grant agreement with the United States Environmental Protection Agency to accept and administer Community Project grant funds in the amount of \$800,000.

## **Background**

The Federal Environmental Protection Agency made available Community Project Grant funding.

The City of Mesa applied for and was awarded \$800,000 in Community Project Grant Funding for its Smart Water Meters Project.

The awarded federal funding for the City of Mesa Smart Meters Project will assist in acquiring approximately 9,560 3/4" smart meters to be connected to properties in Mesa, which will help enhance customer stewardship of water consumption while realizing cost savings and resource efficiency.

#### **Discussion**

The EPA Community Project Grants require a \$200,000 match from the City. Match for this grant will come from Water Utility Revenue Obligations.

#### **Alternatives**

The only alternative to authorizing this grant award acceptance is to deny it. Such action would negate the grant award.

## **Fiscal Impact**

This grant award will provide \$800,000 to support the City in its goal to upgrade to Smart Water Meters for the purpose of reducing waste and conserving water, a critical resource.

There is a match requirement of \$200,000. The City will use Water Utility Revenue Obligations funds to meet this requirement.

Overall operations and maintenance expenses will not increase due to this grant.

#### **Coordinated With**

Staff is coordinating with the Grants Coordinator, City Attorney, and Water Resources departments to ensure the success of this grant project.
