Nick Willis called the meeting to order at 4:03pm.

Items from citizens present: There were no members of the public present.

Introduction of new Director of Arts & Culture Richard M. Parison, Jr: New Director of Arts & Culture Richard Parison, Jr. introduced himself to the board.

Hear, discuss, and provide advice on update report from Director Richard M. Parison, Jr., including programmatic, operational, and administrative items from Arts and Culture: Richard reminded the board of upcoming events. The last Art in the Park event is at Augusta Ranch March 28, 2024, from 5-7pm. The public art piece created during the Art in the Park series will go in the new city hall building when it is completed. Mesa Contemporary Arts Museum's summer opening on May 10, 2024, with the member preview starting at 6pm and the public opening starting at 7pm. Richard also updated the board on the strategic planning process – the staff portion of the process has wrapped, and drafts are now being worked on. When that draft is complete, staff will share it with the board. Simon Tipene Adlam also shared that at 6pm on March 28, 2024, the Arizona Museum of Natural History is presenting the fourth of six in their speaker series, taking place at the Mesa Main Public Library.

Colleen Byron asked about the open Development Director role and Richard stated that would be posted soon.

Nick Willis asked about the State of the Arts and Business in Mesa event on May 8, 2024. Richard gave a brief background on the Arts & Economic Prosperity Study and results, and invited Sarah Goedicke to give more details on the event in May. Sarah Explained that in addition to revealing Mesa's study results to the community, this event will serve as an opportunity to connect the business and arts and culture communities in Mesa to encourage future collaborations and development.

Approval of minutes from the regular November 16, 2023, Meeting: Melvin Van Vorst moved to approve the minutes as written, and Greq DeSimone seconded. Board members voted unanimously to approve the minutes from November 16, and they will be posted on the city's website.

Approval of minutes from the regular January 25, 2024, Meeting: Colleen Byron moved to approve the minutes as written, and Brad Peterson seconded. Board members voted unanimously to approve the minutes from January 25, and they will be posted on the city's website.

Hear, discuss, and provide advice on current neon sign garden located at The Post, update from Vic Linoff: Vic Linoff gave a history of the neon sign movement in Mesa and explained the resources that are needed to restore neon signs. The Mesa Historical Foundation did a survey of all the neon signs on Main Street in 2017, citing about 80 signs in total. The City of Mesa provides storage yard space, help with permitting and technical aspects, as well as some funding to assist with this project. The neon sign garden is still in the conceptual phase.

Katelyn Armbruster asked who is restoring the signs, what other partners the Mesa Historical Foundation has, and if they have planned any educational components. Vic stated that the foundation works with local and regional restorers, but they can't restore them too far in advance of installing them. He also stated that the City of Mesa has been a great supporter of their mission.

Colleen Byron asked if there were any handouts or images. Vic shared some images (**Exhibit A**) with the board. Colleen also asked if the location of the garden has been confirmed and Vic stated that they are still in discussion regarding location.

Hear, discuss, and provide feedback on update report on the i.d.e.a. Museum from Jarrad Bittner, including programmatic, operational, and administrative items from i.d.e.a. Museum in Arts and Culture: Jarrad Bittner, joined by Mike Goodwin and Traci Quinn, shared some updates (Exhibit B) on i.d.e.a Museum's construction starting in summer 2024 and the next exhibit planned for October 2024. Construction on the i.d.e.a Lab and new office space will begin in June 2024 and Jarrad shared concept photos (Exhibit B). Mike Goodwin shared updates on six exterior art pieces being installed between March 2024 and July 2024, including murals, interactive pinwheels, repairs to the musical instruments, and a new interior mural. Mike also shared that the upcoming exhibit will be Joyride: Art on Wheels and showed some example photos of work from artists that will be included in the exhibit.
