## **Purpose and Recommendation**

The purpose of this report is to consider staff's recommendation to extinguish a temporary drainage easement located at 3424 South Ellsworth Road.

## **Background**

Temporary drainage easements are dedicated to the City of Mesa to allow for the retention of storm water drainage from the public rights-of-way on private property. When an easement is no longer needed, or conflicts with new development, the City Council may extinguish the easement to provide owners with the ability to fully utilize their property. To remove an easement from a property's title, the City Council may approve a Resolution to extinguish (abandon) the easement in accordance with provisions in the Mesa City Code, Title 9, Chapter 10.

## **Discussion**

The temporary drainage easement requested for extinguishment was recorded on the map of dedication for Mesa Technology Park, recorded in Book 1496 of Maps, page 20, records of Maricopa County, Arizona. The property owner is requesting the City extinguish the temporary drainage easement to allow for the development of the lot. The property owner will dedicate a new drainage easement with the new development. Therefore, staff has determined that the temporary drainage easement to be extinguished is no longer needed.

## **Alternatives**

An alternative is to not extinguish the temporary drainage easement. Choosing this alternative will result in the property owner not being able to develop the property as planned.

**Fiscal Impact**

The fiscal impact of this request is the \$750.00 processing fee paid by the owner.
