Pre-Submittal Conference: The pre-submittal conference with City of Mesa Development Services staff was held on November 15th, 2022. Staff reviewed the application and provided a list of neighborhood associations and registered neighborhoods within the boundary of the subject site to be contacted.

Action Plan: The following actions were taken to provide opportunities to understand and address any real or perceived impacts that members of the community may have:

- 1. A contact list was developed for citizens and agencies in this area including:
 - a. Flyers mailed to the surrounding area (9,404 for the first virtual public meeting, and 10.855 for the second)
 - b. Weekly Nextdoor posts in advance of the public meeting
 - c. Eastmark HOA Newsletter post
 - d. Mesa Public Library Newsletters and Social Pages
 - e. Press Release (ahead of the first virtual public meeting)
- 2. All persons on the contact list received an invite to the public meetings, held virtually, at which the following was presented for feedback:
 - a. At the first public meeting, a general overview of the project and program was provided, including detail on the process held to date for developing the program through a series of focus group meetings. A general plan layout and concept were presented for public feedback.
 - At the second public meeting, a review of the public comments received was
 presented, including what revisions the team made in response to that feedback.
 A site plan, floor plan, and interior and exterior renderings were presented
 showing a more developed layout for public feedback.
 - c. Surveys were sent out after each public meeting for additional feedback.

3. Presentations were available to citizens upon request, and a copy of the public meeting attendance, questions and answers, survey responses, and email correspondence for each virtual public meeting is attached here for record.

Hello Kimberly,

Thank you for your inquiry regarding the Southeast Mesa Library project. My name is Zac Koceja and I will be the City of Mesa Project Manager for the project.

We are currently working through a project programming phase with Richard Kennedy Architects. As part of the programming phase, the design consultant has been engaged in focus group meetings with library staff, coordination meetings with city departments, stakeholder meetings with adjacent stakeholders in and around the Great Park, and project review meetings with city management.

At the public meeting this evening, we will highlight this process and focus on the items that have emerged through the programming process. We will show a few design graphics that focus on the spatial relationships and adjacencies identified from the programming process thus far. We are fairly early in the overall design phase and do not have detailed design graphics.
