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

Further establishment of protocols and policies for the identification and use of City data, both internally and externally

Cross departmental team identified goals of open data program, evaluated current software platform and determined need for a more robust system

Improve ease of use in accessing, using and analyzing City open data

Continue to foster civic engagement, collaboration and public trust





A Complex Challenge

What we are seeing in Auburn is not unique. Across King County, Washington state, and nationally, we are seeing the suburbanization of poverty, as the poor are priced out of housing in urban centers. In Washington, decades of under-investment in mental health care, developmental disabilities services, and substance abuse treatment are translating into increasing homelessness. In King County, those systemic failures combined with an alarming increase in the cost of housing have further complicated an already complex challenge.






