Subject: Three-Year Term Contract with Two Years of Renewal Options for

Structural/Extrication Personal Protective Equipment for the Mesa Fire and Medical Department (Funded by the Mesa Fire and Medical operating budget

and Public Safety Sales Tax Fund) (Citywide)

Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the award as recommended.

The Mesa Fire and Medical Department and Purchasing recommend awarding the contract to the lowest, responsive and responsible bidders: Freightliner of Arizona, LLC dba Velocity Fire Equipment; L.N. Curtis & Sons; Matlick Enterprises dba United Fire Equipment Company; and Municipal Emergency Services, Inc. at \$500,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

Background / Discussion

This contract will provide structural/extrication personal protective equipment (PPE) for Mesa Fire and Medical members. The fire protective clothing specified represents materials that have been extensively tested and approved for use by the City of Mesa Fire and Medical Department's Equipment Evaluation Committee. The brand, materials, fabrics, special product features, sizes, pattern and colors have been selected because they have proven to be the most effective in training and emergency field operations. Benefits found during testing were higher protection from heat and burns, quicker cool down, quicker drying times of gear, easier movement which provides less body stress to muscles, less fatigue, and lower body temperature. The use of task-specific appropriate single-layer garment extrication PPE is the most effective means to eliminate exposure to carcinogens while drastically reducing thermal assault-related cardiac stress and fatigue.

The solicitation included six separate Groups (1 to 6). Staff is recommending award to the lowest most responsive and responsible bidder of each Group, except structure boots (Group 6). Staff is recommending award of Group 6 to multiple responsive and responsible bidders who met the minimum qualifications and specifications for structure boots. Group 3 was removed from the bid to allow for product testing and evaluations through a formal RFP process.
