

Proposed Ordinance: Public Park Regulations

Mesa City Code Title 6, Chapter 10

April 1, 2021

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<u>Overview</u>

- Proposed ordinance repeals the existing Title 6, Chapter 10 and replaces it with revised public park regulations.
- Scheduled for introduction on April 5 and action on April 19. If approved on April 19, new park regulations will be effective 30 days later, on May 19.
- Revisions to the Code were made in coordination with the City Attorney's Office, City Prosecutor's Office, and Tax and Licensing Office.
- Clarifications and simplifications are made throughout the Code to assist the public and City personnel with Code interpretation and enforcement.
- Primary changes to the Code are described in following slides.

Primary Change: Addition of Permitting Process

Permits required for:

- -special events
- -sale, distribution, or service to public of food, beverage, or other item, attracting 10 or more people
- -ramada, sports field, pool reservations to the exclusion of others
- -use of park outside of posted hours (generally sunrise 10 pm)
- -use of restricted/closed areas
- -consumption of beer or wine

Denial of Permit:

- -incomplete, misleading application
- -interferes with prior permit or event
- -detracts from the public health, safety, welfare, or recreation
- -requires unusual or extraordinary City expense or supervision
- -applicant or event violated the permitting conditions in preceding 18 months
- -applicant or event had a permit revoked in preceding 18 months

Appeals: applicant may appeal a permit denial to the Parks Director 3

Conditions for all permitted events:

- -cannot unreasonably interfere with public health, safety, welfare, recreation
- -cannot incite violence
- -participants cannot engage in disorderly conduct
- -cannot dump or abandon items in the park
- -cannot cause unsafe or unsanitary conditions (e.g. restroom facilities and trash)
- -must remove all property and trash of the event once event is over
- -cannot unreasonably interfere with other events
- -cannot cause undue hardship on neighbors
- -cannot interfere with emergency personnel or park maintenance

Permit revocation: for noncompliance with any of the permit conditions

Other changes to facilitate park enjoyment and enforcement efforts:

- -Cannot dump or abandon food, beverage, clothing, other items in parks, including items intended for donation or distribution to the public
- -Cannot conduct business activities in parks such as peddling, soliciting, or vending unless part of an approved special event
- -Cannot bring shopping carts into parks
- -Can only use drones in areas designated by the Director for drone use (certain basins)
- -Clarifies regulations for dogs in parks (must be on leash except when in training or dog park; must dispose of waste in appropriate receptacle)
- -Clarifies camping prohibitions and permit requirement to camp
- -Adds splashpads to regulations regarding bathing, swimming, wading
- -Adds certain items to list of items that cannot be used in parks (launching device, paraglider, and magnetic fishing device)
- -ADA exceptions are carved out
