Subject: One-Year Renewal to the Term Contract for Private Jail Services for the

Police Department (Citywide)

Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the contract renewal as recommended.

The Police Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the one-year renewal with CoreCivic, Inc. at \$3,600,000.

Background / Discussion

The Mesa Police Department's Holding Facility is a temporary holding facility and processing center located in the Police headquarters building. Subjects that are arrested and waiting for an initial court appearance before a Mesa City Magistrate, are held in the holding facility for no longer than twenty-four hours. Subjects who have been arrested on misdemeanor charges or have been ordered to remain in-custody by a judge are transported by CoreCivic to their facility in Florence.

The agreement with CoreCivic provides jailing services of misdemeanor offenders including booking, transportation, and maintenance and operations of temporary housing. CoreCivic provides feeding, care and treatment, necessary medical care, and applicable social service programs.

CoreCivic has been providing these services to the City since 2017. This is the last renewal term available for the contract. CoreCivic has requested a 2% increase (from \$69.52 to \$70.91) in the per diem rate for housing. The monthly cost for transport (\$35,000) remains unchanged. The City has been satisfied with vendor's performance. This contract continues to be advantageous to the City and is recommended to be in the City's best interest to renew.
