## **Purpose and Recommendation**

The purpose of this report is to request the approval of a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a Project Agreement (PA) between the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) and the City of Mesa.

The PA is for the Val Vista Drive: US60 to Pueblo: Intersection Improvement Project (CP0062) Arterial Life Cycle Program (ALCP) project (RTP Project # ACI-VAL-10-03-B) which defines the regional reimbursement schedule for the Project.

Staff recommend that Council approve the Resolution, authorizing Staff to seek ALCP reimbursements.

### **Background**

In November 2004, the voters of Maricopa County approved a transaction excise tax for the purpose of implementing the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The arterial street component of the RTP, defined in the ALCP, includes major arterial streets and intersection improvements (Arterial Street Improvements) with a revenue allocation. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) allocated Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG) and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) funds to the MAG region as sources of revenue, and these are administered by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and are eligible to be used to implement the RTP.

#### **Discussion**

Funds for ALCP are administered by the ADOT through its Regional Arterial Road Fund (RARF) sub-account for arterial streets, and through allocations of Federal Highway Administration STBG and CMAQ funds that are allocated to the MAG region and administered by ADOT. Funds will be disbursed by ADOT once federal, state or local requirements are satisfied, as applicable, and upon the presentation of an invoice approved or reviewed with concurrence by MAG as provided in this

## Agreement.

The ALCP scope of work includes:

- Val Vista Drive will be widened to accommodate 3 through lanes in each direction that includes associated streetlight and utility relocations.
- Any utility relocation will be identified during the scoping and coordination with utility companies and when the City defines the right-of-way needed for the successful completion of the project.
- There will be the installation of ITS conduit, and the City will replace video detection with loops. Mesa is starting final design by looking at 6 lanes along Val Vista from Enid Avenue (approx. 1,450 ft north of Val Visa/Southern Intersection) to US60 and then reducing the roadway to 5-lanes.

This Project is described in greater detail in the Project Overview submitted by the City, dated April 1, 2021 and on file in the offices of the City and MAG.

#### **Alternatives**

The alternative is to not approve the resolution, which would prevent the City from receiving the eligible reimbursement.

## **Fiscal Impact**

The Val Vista Drive: US60 to Pueblo: Intersection Improvement Project CIP no. CP0062 is an ALCP project and Mesa is eligible for reimbursement for 70% of the project total cost or \$7,230,436.85, whichever is less. If the PA is not approved, then Mesa is no longer eligible for these. The total project cost, for Transportation only, is estimated at \$13,423,001.76 and Mesa must upfront the money as the ALCP is a reimbursement program.

#### **Coordinated With**

This Agreement has been coordinated with the Engineering Department, the Office of Management and Budget, and Financial Services.
