Subject: Use of a Cooperative Contract with an Initial Term of 22-Months and Four Years of Renewal Options for Water and Wastewater Pump Equipment, Parts and Pumping Systems for the Water Resources Department **(Sole Source) (Citywide)**

Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the award as recommended.

The Water Resources Department and Purchasing recommend authorizing the purchase using the City of Chandler cooperative contract with James, Cooke and Hobsons at \$450,000 annually, with an annual increase allowance of up to 5% or the adjusted Consumer Price Index.

Background / Discussion

This contract will provide for the purchase of various pumps, pump equipment, parts and pumping systems. The contract will also be used for maintenance and repair services as allowed by the City of Chandler contract.

The City of Chandler cooperative contract will allow the City of Mesa to replace and repair pumps not covered under the Mesa contract. The Chandler cooperative contract was competitively bid and meets City procurement requirements. Water Resources and Purchasing believe this contract is advantageous to the City and meets the department's immediate and future needs and going out for a formal bid would not result in any significant cost savings to the City.

Water Resources will purchase five, Netzsch-brand pumps for the Greenfield Water Reclamation Plant. This purchase is lifecycle replacement. It would not be practical to change the brand of pumps as piping, motors and foundations would have to be rebuilt to accommodate another brand of pump. Replacing these pumps will bring all primary sludge/pumping back to its designed operational condition and provide redundancy at the plant.

James, Cooke and Hobsons is the authorized and designated distributor for sales and services of Netzsch products and spare parts for municipal water and wastewater facilities in Arizona and Clark County, Nevada.
